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## **The National Law Institute University, Bhopal**

### **An Overview**

The National Law Institute University, Bhopal (NLIU) was established by the Rashtriya Vidhi Sansthan Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam, 1997 enacted by the State Legislature of Madhya Pradesh. The University Degree is recognized by the University Grants Commission and the Bar Council of India. From a modest beginning, the University has distinguished itself both academically and professionally. The University has been rated amongst the best law schools in India and has ever since been scaling new heights of excellence. It has instilled in its students a sense of broad perspective along with scholastic and reflective capabilities that are needed for larger national and humanitarian goals.

The University has been conceived for realization of the need to provide quality legal education, research and training so as to cope-up with the challenges of the new world order. The vision, mission and objectives of the NLIU are as follows:

**Vision-** Our vision is to make NLIU one of the best Centres of legal education, training and research in the world.

**Mission-** Our Mission is to develop and nurture the intellects for the betterment of the nation and humanity through law and justice.

**Objectives-** Our objectives are:

- ☞ to disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal processes and their role in national development;
- ☞ to develop in the students a sense of responsibility and to encourage intellectual freedom and development of personality and outstanding qualities of leadership;
- ☞ to organize lectures, seminars, symposia and conferences to promote legal knowledge and to make law and legal process efficient and effective instrument of social change and development;
- ☞ to develop co-ordination of the bar, bench, academics and industry in planning socially and professionally relevant programme and
- ☞ to promote collaboration and networking with leading national and foreign institutions.

The city is known for its beautiful lakes, symbolizing quiet splendour and solitude offering an environment for learning and development of young minds. It is hub of a number of educational institutions of national and international repute. Prominent among them are the National Judicial Academy, Indian Institute of Forest Management, Indian Institute of Science, Research & Education, Makhanlal Patrakarita Vishwavidyalaya, Rajiv Gandhi Pradyogiki Vishwavidyalaya, National Teachers' Training Institute, Maulana Azad National Institute of Technology and NCERT's Regional Institute of Education, Bhoj Open University, Barkatullah University, Bhopal and SPA (School of Planning and Architect). There is a continuous interaction with all these institutions at different levels.



Formal legal education has indeed come a long way over the previous decades. The University provides the experience that all legal professionals share. It nurtures minds, trains body, transforms soul and shapes identities. The idea that Law University should engage in independent research and study of law as a social institution provides a deeper, analytical and purposive understanding of legal and social institutions. Our vision envisages a fundamental economic and social transformation of society by using legal education, legal institutions and processes of law as effective instruments of far reaching transformation. The NLIU has brought momentous change in professional training over the past decade and has been the guiding factor in the endeavour has been delivering of professional education with a human face. A dominant theme is to respond to the challenges of globalization. Engaging with this theme involves responding effectively to the changing nature of the practice of law (with an increasing shift from dispute settlement to transaction engineering as a main role of a lawyer), and ensuring the quality of new entrants into the practice of law in courts. Teachers with new knowledge and skills are needed in the new world order to reflect upon and explain the changing role of the State and consequently of legal institutions worldwide.

The demand and desire of our students for understanding International Law, Comparative Law and Jurisprudence in addition to domestic law has increased significantly over the years. Their participation in International Moot Court Competitions that range from issues such as Maritime Law, Humanitarian Law and to Dispute Resolution is an evidence. The students therefore, are taught a fair mix of courses that give them knowledge of and training in Indian Law and prepare them for facing the global challenges.

We, at the NLIU, are committed to instill in our students analytical, practical, rational, purposive and predictive thinking and their application through various curricular and extracurricular activities. We believe that a Law University is much more than a place to learn law and its application, it is also about developing a framework of mind with social consciousness. With these objectives in view the N.L.I.U has set up Centres of excellence in order to carry out research, consultancy and training in emerging areas of law. These Centres are :

**Learning Methodology**

The University has adopted modern learning methods, which include audio-visual presentations, tutorial classes, clinical courses, internships and clerkship besides “learning by doing techniques” individually as well as in groups. Learning methods involve both the lecture method and discussion method. The NLIU invites eminent academicians and members of the Bar and Bench regularly as visiting faculty. The University does not prescribe textbooks, it provides the reading material for each course which is designed by respective faculty members and is revised each year to keep it up-to-date. In addition to the credit courses, we have also started non-credit courses from last academic year, such as Law and Economics, International Arbitration etc.

Under the scheme of evaluation, the students are expected to submit a dissertation in the final year, and present project reports, and teaching assignments under the guidance of faculty members, in addition to taking regular examination. In order to maintain transparency in evaluation and also to educate the students about writing answers, the evaluated answer scripts are shown to the students.

It may also be mentioned that the University from this academic year has started organizing short term training programmes during the vacations. One such orientation training programme was organized in partnership with the Centre for Consumer Studies of the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), New Delhi for Presidents and Members of the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Forums of Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Chhattisgarh from January 12-16, 2009.

**Achievements:**

Our faculty and students at the N.L.I.U have taken further strides this year towards achieving excellence, not only in academics, but also in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. Most notable among the numerous achievements of our students are their awards as best team and best speakers in the most prestigious national level moot court competitions: such as M.M.Singhvi Memorial Moot Competition, B.C.I. Moot Court Competition, Sri K.K. Luthra and Surana & Surana Minority Rights Moot Court Competition etc. Our students have also successfully represented the country at various International debates and moot court competitions, such as Philip Jesup International Moot Court Competition, at Washington DC, USA; Manfred Lachs Space Law Moot Court Competition, Sydney; Stetson Environment Law Competition, Florida, USA etc. Our students have been selected to participate in CASRIP organized by School of Law, University of Washington, USA. The students have also been selected for Microsoft Scholarships in IP Law. Our students have also published a number of articles in several reputed international and national professional magazines and journals. Some of these are: International Trade Law Journal, Asia Pacific Journal on Human Rights; The Mallet Street Gazette; Mediterranean Journal of Human Rights Law, Journal of Intellectual Property Rights; Judicial Training & Research Institute Journal; Economic and Political Weekly and several others.

Our faculty has taken up and completed successfully research projects sponsored by the Central and State Governments; N.G.O; U.G.C., ICSSR and several other independent international organizations besides publishing articles in various scholarly journals. The faculty members have also received Fulbright Fellowship and British Council Scholarship to name a few.

**The unique feature** – The highlight of the year 2008-09 was the visit of Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the former President of India, to the N.L.I.U, who delivered first Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi Memorial Lecture on 10<sup>th</sup> of December 2008 on “Law, Technology and Society”. Also a Mock Green Parliament was organized on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> December, 2008 to discuss and deliberate on the model Bill on “The Climate Change (Prevention and Mitigation of Adverse Effects) Bill, 2008 prepared by the students of Cell for Awareness & Research in Environmental Law Studies. Besides, a national Seminar on 21<sup>st</sup> Century Challenges in Protection of Environment in India and NLIU Environment Meet was held in the month of August, 2008.

I would like to submit that every academic institution of quality must bring about meaningful change at the appropriate time in the flow of continuity. In view of this our thrust is the “continuity with change”. We are planning to set up at least four more Centres of excellence, such as, Centre for Law, Policy and Governance, Centre for study of Biodiversity, Centre for Environmental Law and Policy and Centre for Media Law etc. to provide further impetus to our current research and training programmes. In addition, we are trying hard to get specialised chair professorships such as in the areas of Cyber Crime, Consumer Justice and Law and Global Terrorism.

Before I conclude, I wish to place on record the tremendous support and guidance we received from our Hon'ble Chief Justice of India, the Visitor of the University and Hon'ble Chief Justice, High Court of Madhya Pradesh, the Chairman of the University and respected Members of the General Council, the Executive Council and the Academic Council of the University.

**3.9: The Centers of Learning / Cells****3.9.1: Rajiv Gandhi Cyber Law Centre:**

The University, in its attempt to bring excellence in legal education, has established the Rajiv Gandhi National Cyber Law Centre. This has been established with a grant of five crore rupees from the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India. The Centre is expected to do policy research, consultancy and advising in the areas of Cyber-governance, Cyber-crime, Cyber-terrorism, Information Technology, data prohibition etc.

**3.9.2: Intellectual Property Rights, MHRD Chair**

The NLIU has been chosen to institute the Intellectual Property Rights Chair of the Ministry of Human Resource and Development, New Delhi. This Chair has become functional and the activities in the laws relating to IPR have also started.



**3.9.3: IGNOU Programme Study Centre:**

NLIU had signed an MOU with Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and a Programme Study Centre was setup on the campus. Presently, the University is running a Post Graduate Certificate in Cyber Law (PGCCL) in collaboration with IGNOU.

**3.9.4: Activities of Cells/Associations:****(i) Literacy and Debating Society (Law and Culture)**

Jus Cultura, headed by Dr Mukesh Srivastava, the faculty – in charge, is the literacy and debating society of the University. It consists of a close-knit group of students brought by the common dedication to facilitate the study of the intersection of law and culture in myriad ways.

The Committee in the last year has been involved in a host of literacy activities. This year is organised a pictographic essay competition for the first year students, to which it received an enthusiastic response. The top three entries are to be published in the subsequent edition of the wavelength. This was followed by an animated discussion on the same. We also plan to have a host of other literacy activities later this year, one of them being The All India Inter University Debate Competition (modeled on the Big Flight), involving majority of the National Law Schools across India.

In addition to being the Debating Society, the committee has been entrusted with the responsibility of conducting internal debate selections. This year the Debating pool comprising of twelve people has been formed through a rigorous selection procedure involving two rounds- an extempore round in which over forty people participated and the final debating round in the form of a parliamentary debate the topic of which was “Every body loves a good drought”. Eighteen people were short listed from the extempore round for the final debating round. Out of these, twelve were selected from the final rounds to constitute the Debate Pool which will represent the University in various national and international debating competitions this year.

The fruits of the extensive selection process which we follow have already started to grow. In the various debate competitions in which the University has participated till date in this academic year, we have done exceedingly well. Foremost being the accomplishment in the 15<sup>th</sup> All Asians Debate, where the University represented by Mr. Avinash Jha, Mr. Sabarjeet Singh and Mr. Rijoy Bhaumik stood 19<sup>th</sup> amongst over 100 universities from all over Asia. After having taken part in the All Asians Debate last year, this year the University intends on giving international exposure to our debates by participating in further international debates like WUDC (World University Debate Championship), AUDC (Asian University Debate Championship) and tentatively Cambridge and Oxford Debate Competitions.

### **3.9.5: Moot Court Association:**

#### **Objectives:**

The MCA at the National Law Institute University, Bhopal was constituted in the academic year 2001-02. A formal Constitution was adopted with the due approval from the Director of the University to govern the functioning of the body and to further the following aims:

- Encourage students to actively participate in both internal and external moot court competitions.
- Develop amongst the students the skills of effective research and argumentation.
- Achieve Excellence in Mooting at both National and International levels.
- Promote a spirit of healthy competition and teamwork among students.

The birth of the MCA reflects the triumph of the spirit of the students who tirelessly worked to succeed against all sorts of infrastructural and administrative odds. Needless to say, they were ably assisted in their noble endeavor by members of the faculty.

#### **MCA in the Eighth Year:**

Now in its eighth year, the MCA has long formalised the structure and procedure for the selection of teams to represent the University in various national level competitions during the academic session. The MCA's policies have been guided by the effort to balance the interests of the University with those of the students, thus providing for maximum representation in competitions yet ensuring that individual talent and growth potential of the students is not stifled. In keeping with its objectives, the MCA has also initiated a number competitions at the University level in order to expose the maximum number of students to the world of mooting and inspire them to partake in more such activities. Taking upon itself the responsibility of improving the standard of mooting in the University, the MCA has also implemented a number of policies to train the students in the skills required and assist them in their preparation for various competitions. The success of the MCA's policies can be gauged from the marked increase in the number of trophies won by the University since the birth of the MCA.

#### **Inter Batch Moot Court:**

The MCA annually organizes the Inter Batch Moot Court Competition for the students, with a view to develop amongst students the skills of effective researching and cogent arguments, these being the most important skills required in a lawyer. The special focus of the competition remains on introducing the students of the first year to the various aspects of mooting. The Inter Batch Moot Court Competition provides the desired platform to potential mooters to sharpen and groom their mooting skills and get an in-house experience of mooting before they actually step into the realm of national level mooting.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Inter Batch Moot Court Competition in the series was also organized with this objective. The scheme of the competition included a Preliminary Round through which eight teams consisting of a minimum of two and a maximum of three students each qualified for the Quarter-Finals. The Quarter-Finals determined the top four

teams that constituted the Semi-Finalists, and the winners of the Semi-Finals went on to take each other at the Finals. The competition was based on two propositions, one for the Preliminary Rounds based on Law of Contracts and the Specific Relief Act and one for the Quarters, Semis and the Final Round based on Constitutional Law and Parliamentary Privileges. Students had been working on these propositions for almost a month and the extraordinary effort employed by them was evident in their quality performance. Continuing with the innovative step taken by the MCA, experienced mooters of the fourth and fifth year were selected to preside over the benches and comprehensive counseling session of all the participants by the judges were held after the rounds. The Final Round was presided over by Senior Partner and Associates of Bhopal based law firms and practicing advocates.

**Surana & Surana – Trial Advocacy Competition:**

Carving out an entirely distinct niche, the University became the first in the State of Madhya Pradesh to host a National Moot Court Competition and the first in the country to incorporate the real nuances of a court room trial in a moot court competition, aptly called the Trial Advocacy Competition. The event drew participation from a host of reputed Universities and Law Colleges across the country. The competition which was a three day affair was a success tale of the collaboration between the University with Surana & Surana International Attorneys who have shown unflinching interest and commitment for exposing students across the country in attaining proficiency in advocacy skills before they get absorbed in the profession. Mr Vinod Surana, Senior Partner of the Surana & Surana International Attorneys takes a personal interest in this whole exercise of mooting for students by being involved in the organization of a league of moots throughout the year and across the country and was deeply involved in the modalities and preparations for the Trial Advocacy Competition.

The problem, a case under Section 302 of the Indian Penal Code, involved a murder trial assimilating the intricacies which occur in actuality. The realism and distinctiveness of the competition rested on the examination and cross-examination of witnesses presenting the true shades of a court room trial. The pool of witnesses was constituted from amongst the students of the University who were specially oriented and trained by eminent legal practitioners in Criminal Law to play the roles of Investigating Officer, Doctor, Accused, Prosecution and Defence Witnesses. Complementing this, Madhya Pradesh State Forensic Science Expert, Dr Sathpathy was invited to conduct an orientation programme for the student witnesses elucidating the practical aspects of forensic sciences and their applicability in a real murder trial by way of post mortem report etc. The trial rounds were presided over by several legal luminaries including Justice D.M. Dharmadhikari, Judge, Supreme Court and Chairman, M.P. Human Rights Commission, Justice Deepak Mishra and Justice S.L. Kochar of M.P. High Court who graced the Final Rounds of the Competition. Rich contribution was extended over by the alumni of the University as also by a large number of students who endeavored tirelessly for the success of the entire event.

(Hons.), Students in cross examination of witnesses under Evidence Act 1872.

An imaginary criminal case file was created and interested students were divided in four groups with a head of every group. Copies of case file and examination in chief of complainant, eye witness, Medico legal Expert (Doctor) and investigating Officer were made available to every student and respective witnesses.

Students were given opportunity to cross examine witnesses and they put their best endeavour in this process. The cross examination of all witnesses was concluded by Shri N.K. Gupta indicating omitted necessary questions. At the end, Shri. N. K. Gupta and his colleagues Shri. J. K. Vaidya (Secretary, Law Deptt.), Shri. B. K. Nigam (Addl. Secretary , Law Deptt.) and Shri. V. P. Shukla (Addl. Secretary , Law Deptt.) had detailed discussion with the students indicating relevant, irrelevant, omitted, supportive and damaging questions for prosecution and defence side in cross examination. Being a part of practical cross examination of witnesses under able and experienced guidance of Shri. N. K. Gupta and his colleagues the student participants of NLIU in this program were greatly benefited.

## 5. LIBRARY:

Library is a hub for the information resource storage and dissemination in the field of law and allied subjects. It serves as partner in supporting the teaching, learning and research activities of the university. It is located centrally in a very magnificent, aesthetically designed building called the Gyan Mandir, a temple of knowledge. At present it has 13183 collections, which include books, loose issues of law reviews, journals and back volumes of journals. Apart from this the library also subscribes electronic resources databases. If they implemented state-of-the-art facilities, automation, e-learning and RFID (Radio Frequency Identification System) based security system for effective management and dissemination of information services.

### Library Services

The Library develops and delivers user-focused library services that support and enhance academic research programmes of the university.

### Collection Development

The Library acquires materials that meet the current and foreseeable future needs for teaching and research. Selections of resources are made to ensure a balanced collection between types of material, between jurisdictions, and between currently taught subjects, within existing budgetary constraints. Our collection development policy strives to make it capable of supporting a high level of achievement in teaching and research in the University. A library committee consisting of Prof. G. S. Bajpai as Chairman along with seven members of faculty, advises on the selection of books, journals, electronic databases and other related issues of library. The Dy. Librarian acts as a convener. Apart from the subscription to the journals and reviews, the University is also receiving quite a few significant foreign periodicals and law reviews on Gratis and Exchange.

**Automation**

In order to accomplish the objectives of increased operational efficiencies and relieve the staff from monotonous chores and enhance their productivity to user centered services, the Library has initiated automation and migration from manual methods to computerized system using VTLIS software. Apart from automation, the Library has also implemented RFID based solutions to perform circulation, inventory, and multiple object identification, tracking and material flow management at a faster pace and in an efficient manner.

**Hardware**

Library has highly configured server with 13 desktops. Out of these eight are meant for the students and members of faculty for browsing E-databases. A high end scanner and network printer is also installed for providing user services.

**Library Website**

Libraries in the contemporary information society are increasingly relying on web technologies to disseminate the content and information services which are no longer limited to traditional physical and technical architectures. A web portal also assists the library users to access resources from their desk top.

Library website developed as single windows access for legal information. In-house resources, digital repositories, e-learning portal along with subscribed databases are linked with it.

### **Disability Access**

For visually impaired peoples, the library has acquired the following software and hardware to facilitate access to the resources.

#### **JAWS (Job Access with Speech)**

JAWS will read loud information on the screen which can be used with the windows desktop, the internet and the standard software, including word processors, spreadsheets and databases. JAWS can be customized to allow the selection of different voices and different reading speeds.

#### **Kurzweil 1600**

This software is used in conjunction with a standard scanner, Kurzweil 1000 which displays and reads aloud a scanned material on screen. This software is particularly useful for those with dyslexia, poor sight and learning difficulties.

#### **Index Braille**

The Index Braille converts documents to Braille. This printer is imported from Sweden and Braille documents are produced on request.

#### **E- Learning (Electronic Courseware)**

Electronic learning (or e-Learning or eLearning) is a type of Technology Supported Education/Learning (TSL) where the medium of instruction is through computer, communication technology, and digital technologies. It emphasizes a diversity of perspectives and functionalities that institutions adopt to support teaching and research. Keeping this in mind, the Library has created e-Learning portal using Brihaspati E-Learning open sources software to facilitate teaching and research and content delivery.

### **FUTURE PLANS**

#### **Collection Development**

The Acquisitions for the next five years will include at least 20,000 volumes comprising Back Volumes of Law reviews, Journals and Digests apart from books as the University has introduced P.G. courses and number of Diploma courses as well.

#### **Electronic Databases**

Addition of valuable electronic resources related to the law and allied discipline in which the university is providing academic and research facility is an endeavour to be accomplished.

#### **Development of Digital Library / Institutional Repository**

Institutional repositories are gaining momentum to enhance dissemination of scholarly publishing and communication. Universities and research libraries in India and around the world are utilizing the



institutional repositories in scholarly communication.

There is a dire need to store, organize and disseminate all in-house publications and content generated at various levels at university for wider dissemination and archival.

- The main purpose of the Digital Library / Institutional Repository would be

- : To promote efficient delivery of information to all users;

To expedite the systematic development of procedures to collect, store, organize information in digital form;

To strengthen communication and encourage collaboration between and among law firms, high court libraries and all libraries of law schools;

To take leadership role in generation and dissemination of Legal information in major areas of research.

Through this programme, an effort will be made to familiarize the users with the resources, services, and facilities offered by the Library and its policies to use the same.

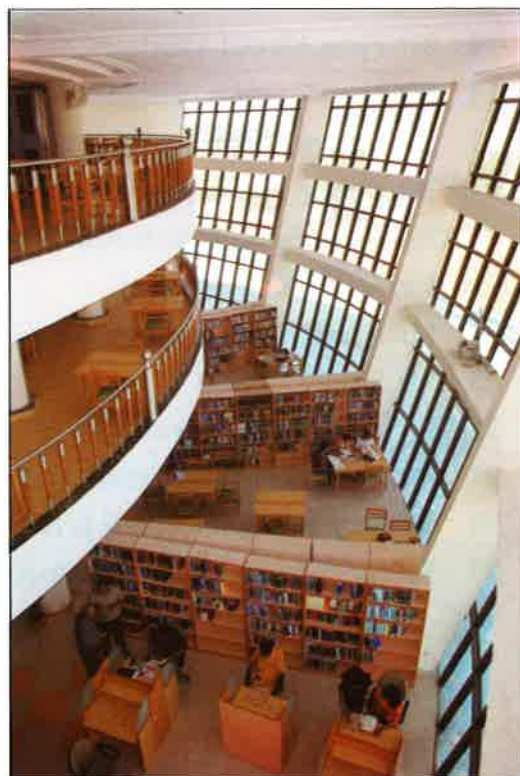

## 7.2: Information Technology Development

On July 28, 1999 the Computer Lab was established with thirty Desktop PCs and one IBM Server and a Printer. There was no Internet Facility in the Computer Lab as no regular telephone service was available. In the Year 2000, we managed to get 64 KBPS ISDN Line to provide Internet Services to the Students on six computers. In the year 2005, the Government of M.P gave us a special grant to develop the infrastructure of the University and University established a 2 MBPS leased circuit from BSNL and developed a Computers Lab with 92 computers. This' was inaugurated by the Hon'ble HRD Minister Shree Arjun Singh. The University has also developed a Wire Less Fidelity (Wi-Fi) Zone on entire campus with 21 Access Points which provide faster Internet connectivity. The Wi-Fi facility was dedicated to the Nation by the Hon'ble Justice Mr. A.K. Patnaik, Chief Justice, M.P. High Court in February 2005-06. Since then the University has made remarkable development in the area of Information Technology and we can take pride in having one of the best IT infrastructures among all National Law Schools in the country.

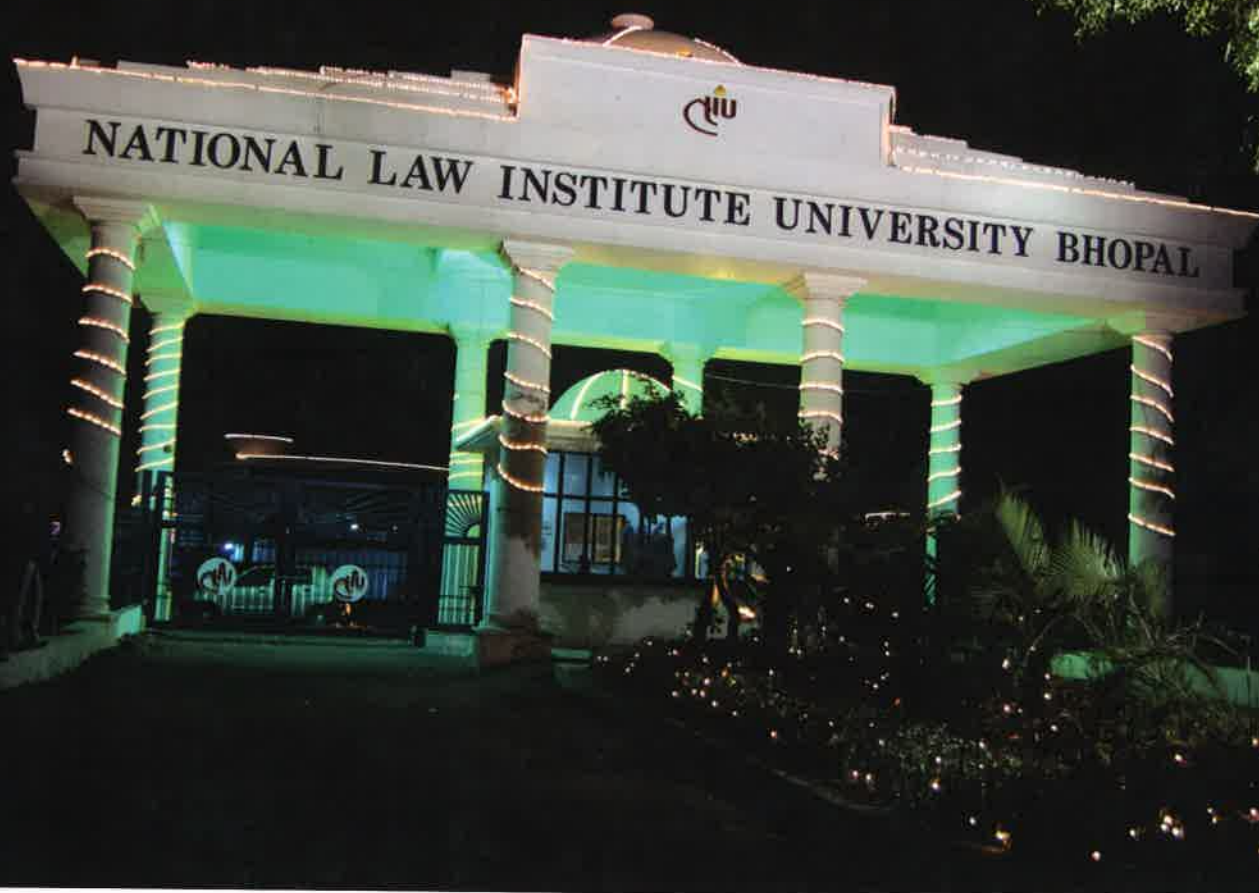
