About NLIU Bhopal

The National Law Institute University (NLIU) was established by the Rashtriya Vidhi Sansthan Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam (Act No. 41 of 1997 of the Madhya Pradesh Legislature). NLIU is recognized by both the University Grants Commission and the Bar Council of India. The university was established to fill the gap and provide the most modern legal education through multidisciplinary teaching and training in new skills essential for the legal profession. The university launched its first academic program with a five-year B.A. LL.B. (Hons.), which commenced on September 1, 1998.

NLIU has successfully instilled a sense of broad perspective along with scholastic and reflexive capabilities bearing in mind larger national and humanitarian goals in its students. Over the years, NLIU has been designing and delivering courses to enhance the ability and capacity of the students, faculty, and other participants to avoid and resolve problems under the framework of law.

Academic Activities

We began the year with a Moot Court Session on New Criminal Laws on 5th January, followed by a Workshop on Data Protection with Trilegal on 6th and 7th January. The Lex Peretia Knowledge Series included a workshop on "Negotiation in High Conflict Situations." On 28th January, our Legal Aid Clinic celebrated the Supreme Court's anniversary with a quiz. Our annual Techtonic 2024 event took place from 2nd to 4th February, and the 9th NLIU-Trilegal Summit on Corporate and Commercial Laws was held later in February.

The 3rd NLIU-Global Symposium on Labor and Employment Laws was conducted on 17th to 18th. On 24th February, we hosted the 1st NLIU-AZB & Partners Certificate Course on Sustainable Energy. The National Seminar on Health Law took place on 27th-28th March, and the NLIU Agreement Drafting Competition on 30th March 2024. The 4th NLIU National Conference on Gender and Law was held on 2nd-3rd April, and a panel discussion on India's Green Hydrogen Mission was held on 3rd April. The NLIU-Justice R.K. Tankha Memorial International Arbitration Moot was conducted from 5th to 7th April, followed by the 12th NLIU-INADR International Mediation Tournament from 22nd to 24th March. Finally, the 7th NLIU-Khaitan & Co. Certificate Course on Corporate Laws took place on 20th and 21st April.

Extra-Curricular Activities

The 75th Republic Day celebrations were a huge success, featuring a Box Cricket League, various sports games, an inspiring walkathon, and a

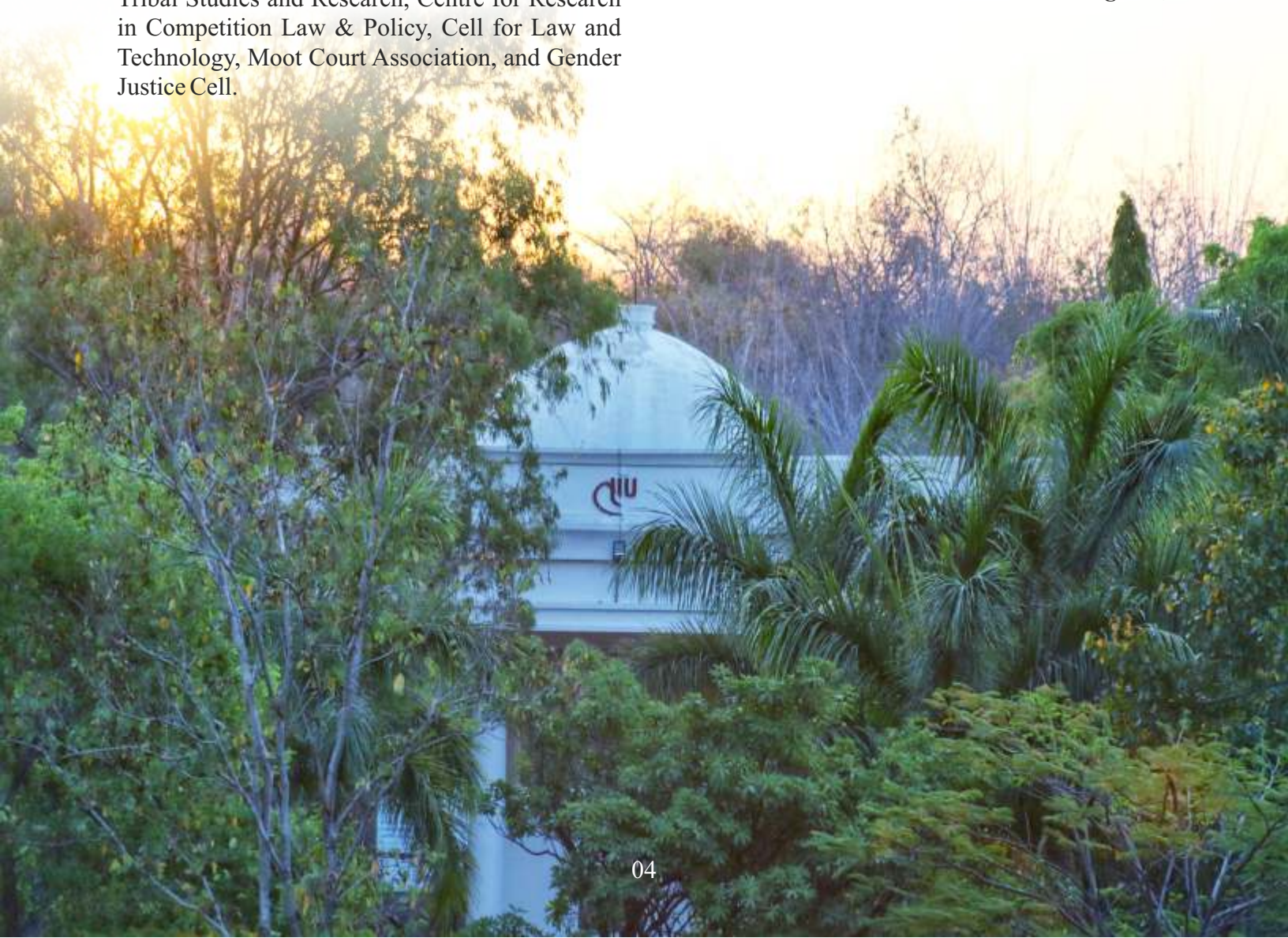
Achieving Excellence in Student Placements

Hon'ble Shri Justice Hrishikesh Roy
Judge, Supreme Court of India

Justice Hrishikesh Roy took oath on 23rd September, 2019 as a Judge of the Supreme Court. Prior to this, he had served as the 35th Chief Justice of the High Court of Kerala since 8th August, 2018. Earlier, on 29.05.2018, he was transferred from the Gauhati High Court.

Justice Roy was born on 1st February 1960. He obtained his LL.B Degree from the Campus Law Centre, University of Delhi in 1982. On 21.12.2004, he was designated as Senior Advocate, by the Gauhati High Court.

Justice Roy was sworn-in as an Additional Judge of Gauhati High Court on 12.10.2006 and served as permanent Judge with effect from 15.07.2008. In Assam, while heading the Mediation Monitoring Committee, the film Shako (Bridge) was produced and this film was used as a training tool in the Mediation programmes. Later, the Arunachal Pradesh Legal Services Authority led by Justice Roy, produced Apne Ajnabi, a short film on the theme of racial prejudice. The film showcased how legal help could be provided for the needy, under the Legal Services Authority Act, 1987.

As the Executive Head of the Assam State Legal Services Authority, Justice Roy had implemented the Reach Out & Respond programme, to facilitate access to justice, for the marginalised sections of Assam. He was spearheading the training programmes for the Judicial Officers under the Gauhati High Court and was nominated as a member of the National Judicial Academic Council, headed by the Chief Justice of India. For about 10 years the News Letter ATMAN was published regularly for the Gauhati High Court under Justice Roy's editorship.

Chancellor of the University

Justice Ravi Vijaykumar Malimath took the oath of office on 14.10.2021 as the Chief Justice of High Court of Madhya Pradesh. He had graduated from the M.E.S. College, Bangalore and later studied law at the Sri Jagadguru Renukacharya College of Law. Thereafter, he joined the chambers of Sri Shivraj Patil. He practiced across various legal domains, earning expertise in Constitutional, Civil, Criminal, Labor, and Service law.

Appointed as an Additional Judge of the High Court of Karnataka in 2008, he became a Permanent Judge in 2010. Noteworthy for delivering landmark judgments, he served as President of the Bangalore Mediation Centre and the Karnataka Judicial Academy. Transferred to the High Court of Uttarakhand in 2020, he held key positions such as Executive Chairman of the Uttarakhand State Legal Services Authority and Acting Chief Justice. In 2021, he moved to the High Court of Himachal Pradesh, assuming roles as the Executive Chairman of the Himachal Pradesh State Legal Services Authority and Acting Chief Justice.

Later, he was elevated as the Chief Justice of the High Court of Madhya Pradesh in October 2021.

The presiding judge provided valuable insights on the 'rarest of the rare' doctrine, emphasizing the gravity of circumstances warranting the death penalty. A poignant case involving a child's heinous crime highlighted the immense responsibility associated with such judgments. The event concluded with a farewell ceremony, honoring participants with certificates and capturing the occasion with a group photograph.



NLIU-CLT Trilegal Workshop on Data Protection



The NLIU Cell for Law and Technology, in collaboration with Trilegal, held a two-day interactive workshop on Data Protection on the 6th and 7th January 2024, at the NLIU campus. 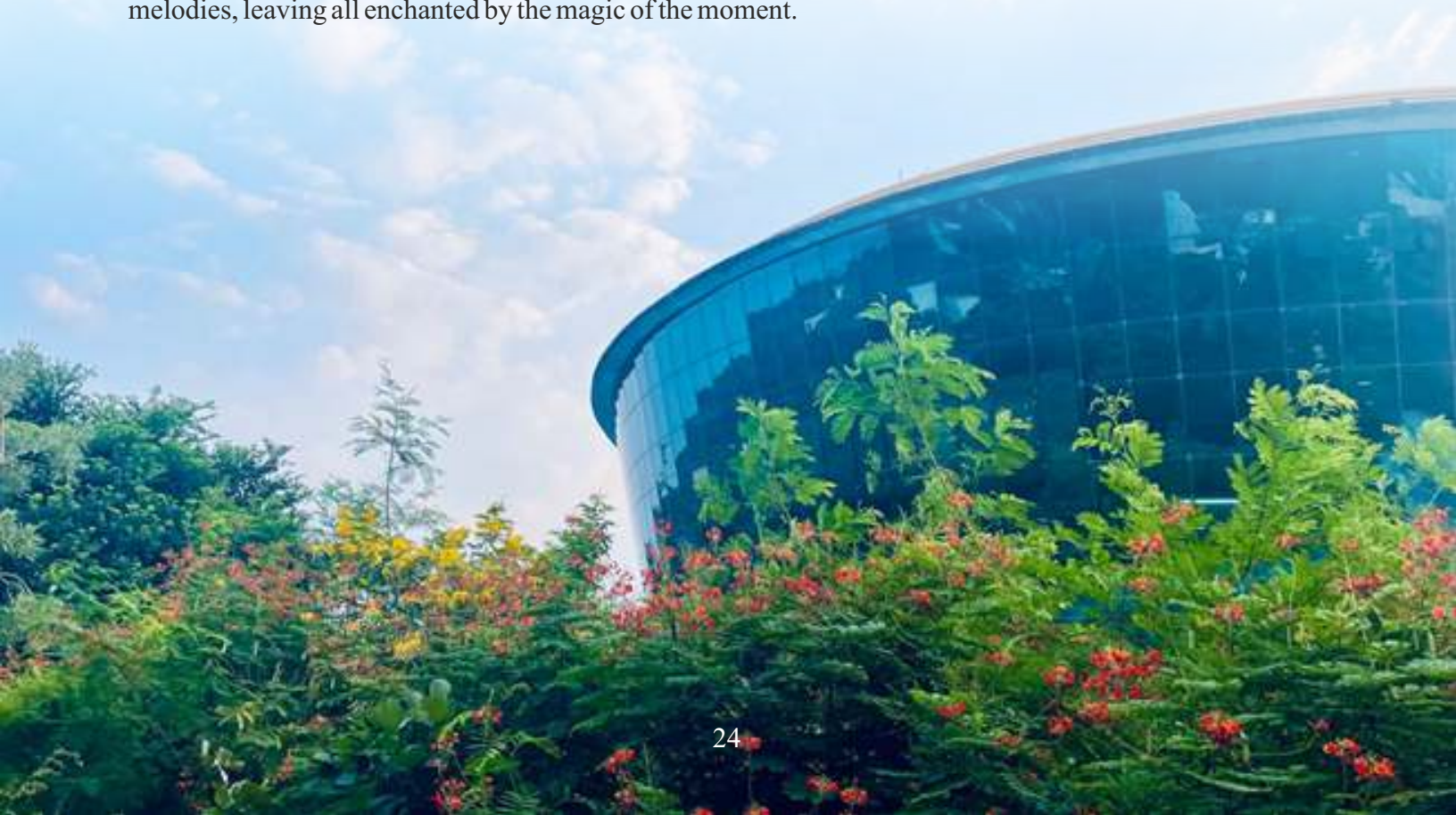


strategic negotiation. The session concluded with a vote of thanks from Sanyam Gupta, Convenor of the ADRC, marking the event as a valuable learning experience.

7th NLIU-Khaitan Co. Certificate Course on Corporate Laws from 20th to 21st April 2024



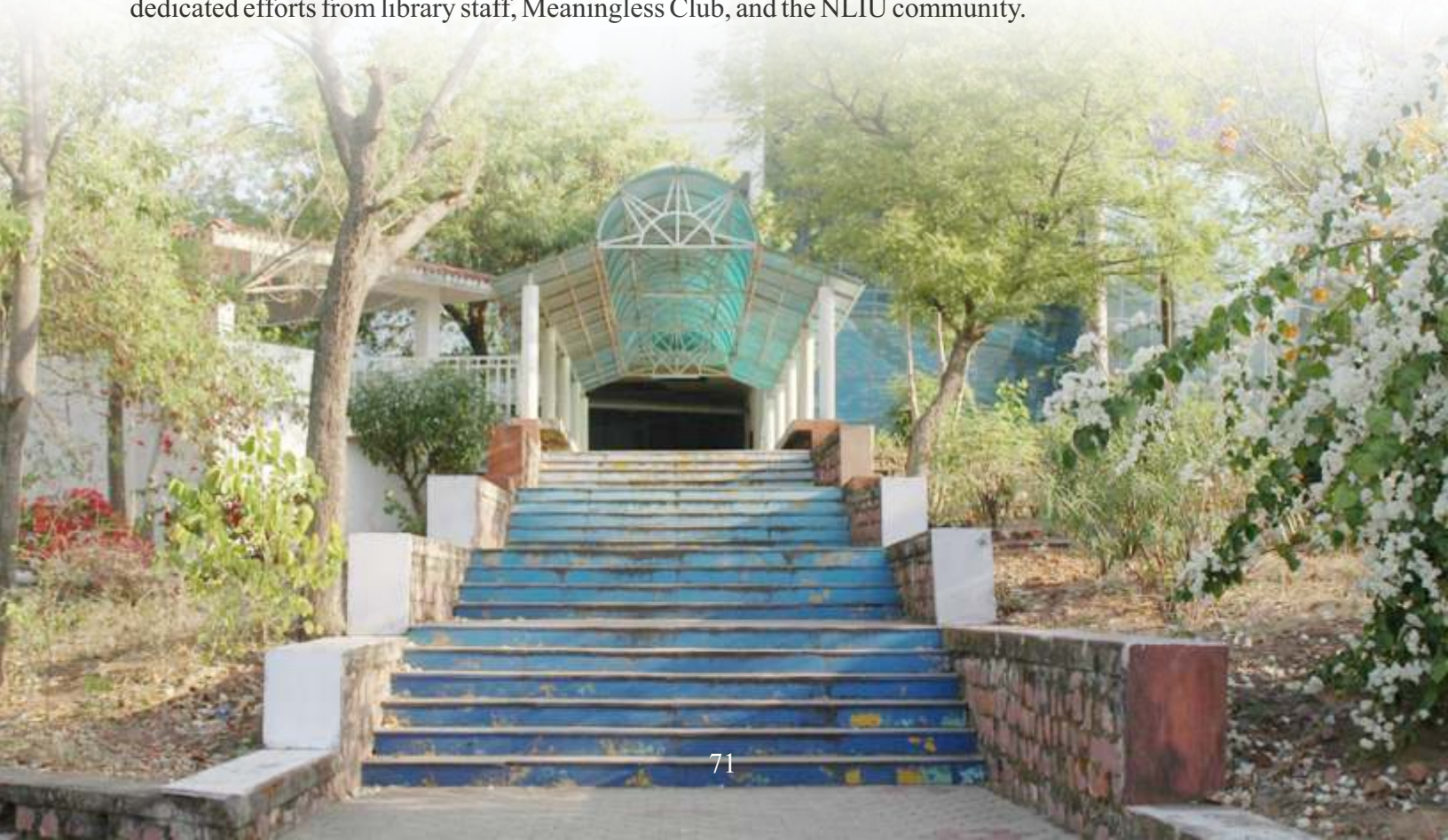

नेशनल लॉ इंस्टीट्यूट यूनिवर्सिटी (एनएलआईयू) के छात्रों ने पिछले चार साल के दौरान फर्लू हिंस, आपसी और जमीन संबंधी विवाद के 400 से ज्यादा मामले सुनवाए। छात्रों द्वारा एक लाख से कम इन्कम वाले परिवारों की मदद की जाती है, जिसमें वे करीब 25 किलो की मदद भी लेते हैं।

सबसे खास बात यह है कि छात्र आसपास के ग्रामीण क्षेत्रों में पहुंच कर सर्वे करते हैं और गांव के लोगों के केस लड़ने में मदद भी करते हैं। साथ ही यूनिवर्सिटी द्वारा एक मोबाइल एप 'न्याय बंधु' के माध्यम से भी प्रे-बेनो स्कीम चलाई जाती है। इसी एप से करीब 25 वकील जुड़े हुए हैं, जो आर्थिक रूप से कमजोर लोगों

के केस लड़ने में निःशुल्क मदद करते हैं। कुछ साल पहले केंद्र सरकार की लॉ मिनिसट्री ने देशभर में संचालित लॉ यूनिवर्सिटीज को गरीब लोगों को न्याय दिलाने के लिए प्रो-बोना स्कीम संचालित करने को कहा था।

इसके बाद से एनएलआईयू भाषाल ने भी स्क्रीम शुरू की और मंत्रालय द्वारा बनाए गए मेडाल एफ के मध्यम से गरीब लोगों को कानूनी सलाह उपलब्ध करवाने की शुरुआत की गई। इसके तहत निःशुल्क कानूनी संबंधी सहायता के अलावा साक्षरता, मध्यस्थता और मानसिक व स्वास्थ्य परामर्श आदि गतिविधियाँ संचालित की जाती हैं। जिला विधिक सेवा प्राधिकरण के मध्यम से भी गरीब लोगों की पैरवी से लेकर अन्य मदद करवाई जाती है।

को ट्रांसफर कर दिया जाता है। इस एप के माध्यम से लोग भी स्थिति तौर पर अपने मामले रजिस्टर्ड कर सकते हैं। जो लोग एप के माध्यम से रजिस्टर्ड नहीं कर पाते, उन्हें स्कीम फैकल्टी को-ऑर्डिनेटर नेहा शर्मा और संबंधित विद्यार्थियों के माध्यम से रजिस्टर्ड करवाने की सुविधा मिल जाती है। इसके बाद जो जिन मामलों में स्पष्टीकरण की गुंजाइश होती है उन्हें रजिस्टर्ड कर नि-शुल्क पैवी शुरू करवा दी जाती है।

यह भी खास...

वाइस चान्सेलर प्रो. सुर्व प्रकाश ने बताया कि फाइनेल ईयर के छात्र जरूरतमंदों को कानूनी सलाह देते हैं। यह निरुपेक्ष दी जाती है। पिछले दो-छाई साल के दौरान ही करीब 150 से ज्यादा मामले न्याय बंधु एप के द्वारा सुलझाए गए हैं। इन मामलों में भी एनलरआईयू के छात्र, पूर्व छात्रों व संबद्ध वकीलों द्वारा कानूनी सलाह दी गई। सबसे खास बात यह भी है कि हर मामले में मोबाइल एप के माध्यम से सेरी 4 से 5 महीने एनलरआईयू तक मदद के लिए पहुंच रहे हैं। सबसे ज्यादा फेलू हिंसा, अपराध और संपत्ति विवाद, वसयत संबंधी और जमाना के आवेदन शामिल हैं।

NLIU की लीगल एड क्लिनिक... इससे जुड़े हैं हाई कोर्ट और डिस्ट्रिक्ट कोर्ट के 35 एडवोकेट हर साल 150 मामलों में फ्री-कानूनी मदद देती है यह टीम

नैशनल लॉ इंस्टीट्यूट यूनिवर्सिटी (एनएलआईयू) में 2018 में शुरू हुई लीगल एड क्लिनिक ने बीते 6 सालों में 800 से ज्यादा केसों को ना सिर्फ सुलझाया, बल्कि छात्रों से पॉइंट टू पॉइंट केसों में जल्दी न्याय भी दिलवाया। खास बात यह है कि इस क्लिनिक में मिलने वाले फ्रीलाइ एक्स्पेरियंस का डिस्ट्रिक्ट स्कोर लीगल क्लिनिक्स में अब इनका जगह बढ़ गया है कि वीकें 20 स्टूडेंट्स के इनिशिएटिव से शुरू क्लिनिक में काम करने के लिए अब हर सप्ताह 150 से ज्यादा स्टूडेंट्स एक्टिवेशन करीम करते हैं। अभी क्लिनिक में 70 मेम्बर हैं। क्लिनिक में कनिष्ठ की डिप्लोमा पढ़ाना और के स्टूडेंट विजिलेंस पाल के पास और को-कन्वर्नर की रिस्पॉन्सिबिलिटी प्रोफेसर कुमार अख्य के पास है। वर्तमान में काउन्सिलर देने के लिए क्लिनिक के पास 3-6 एडवोकेट का पैनल है, जिनमें से ज्यादातर एनएलआईयू के ही एडवोकेट हैं, जो भोपाल या जबलपुर हाई कोर्ट में प्रैक्टिस कर रहे हैं।



गांवों में भी लगाते हैं कानूनी सहायता शिविर

विजयपाल पास ने बताया- क्लिनिक शुरू करने का आइडिया क्लिनिक के पहले कानूनीर हुसैन अली और खडू संतोषका प्रत्यक्ष हस्तक्षेप का था। यों तो नियमों के बिना हमें हर लॉ कॉलेज में एक क्लिनिक सहायता केंद्र होना जरूरी है, लेकिन देश में काम ही ऐसी क्लिनिक है, जो सुचारु रूप से काम करे। भोपाल में क्लिनिक को शुरू करने के पीछे एनएलआईयू से सटे मेडोरी और मेडोरी गांवों की भी भूमिका है, क्योंकि स्टूडेंट्स अक्सर यहां के लोगों से

मिलते थे और देखते थे कि इनके मदद को जरूरत होती है, लेकिन वे मान नहीं पाते। एनएलआईयू लीगल एड क्लिनिक ने मेडोरी गांव को एडोप्ट किया है, यहां के लोग किसी भी समस्या या समस्या के लिए वॉलंटियर क्लिनिक के सेवकों में आते हैं। अब स्थिति ऐसी बन गई है कि क्लिनिक दूर दूर तक के बाकी गांवों में जाकर भी कानूनी सहायता शिविर लगाती है, क्योंकि मेडोरी के अधिकांश मामले खुद ही क्लिनिक के पास आ जाते हैं।

दो तरह के मामले ज्यादा आते हैं...

अधिकांश कुमार ने बताया- हमारे पास 2 तरह के मामले ज्यादा आते हैं, एक तो कोर्ट केस, जिसमें कोर्ट केस को संभालना है और दूसरा अगर किसी को किसी सरकारी एजेंसी का लक्ष्य नहीं मिल रहा, दस्तावेजों में गड़बड़ी आ रही है। अक्सर हम साल हमारे पास कानूनी विवाद से जुड़े लगभग 80-100 मामले आते हैं, लेकिन वे सब मामले कोर्ट नहीं जाते। कुछ मामलों में कानूनी सहायता देने के बाद कांस्टेबल खाने वाले से सम्बन्धित करने का प्रयास करते हैं, क्योंकि कोर्ट के मामले लम्बे चलते हैं। इनके अलावा अगर दस्तावेजों के मामलों की बात की जाए तो इसी खान हम एक गैर समुदाय की बस्ती की मदद कर रहे हैं, जहां करीब 400 लोग रहते हैं। लेकिन, इनके पास कांस्टेबल स्टेशनियट नहीं है। इससे न ही उन्हें सरकारी सुविधाओं का लाभ मिल रहा है और अलग से प्रार्थना भी डोलने पड़ रही है।

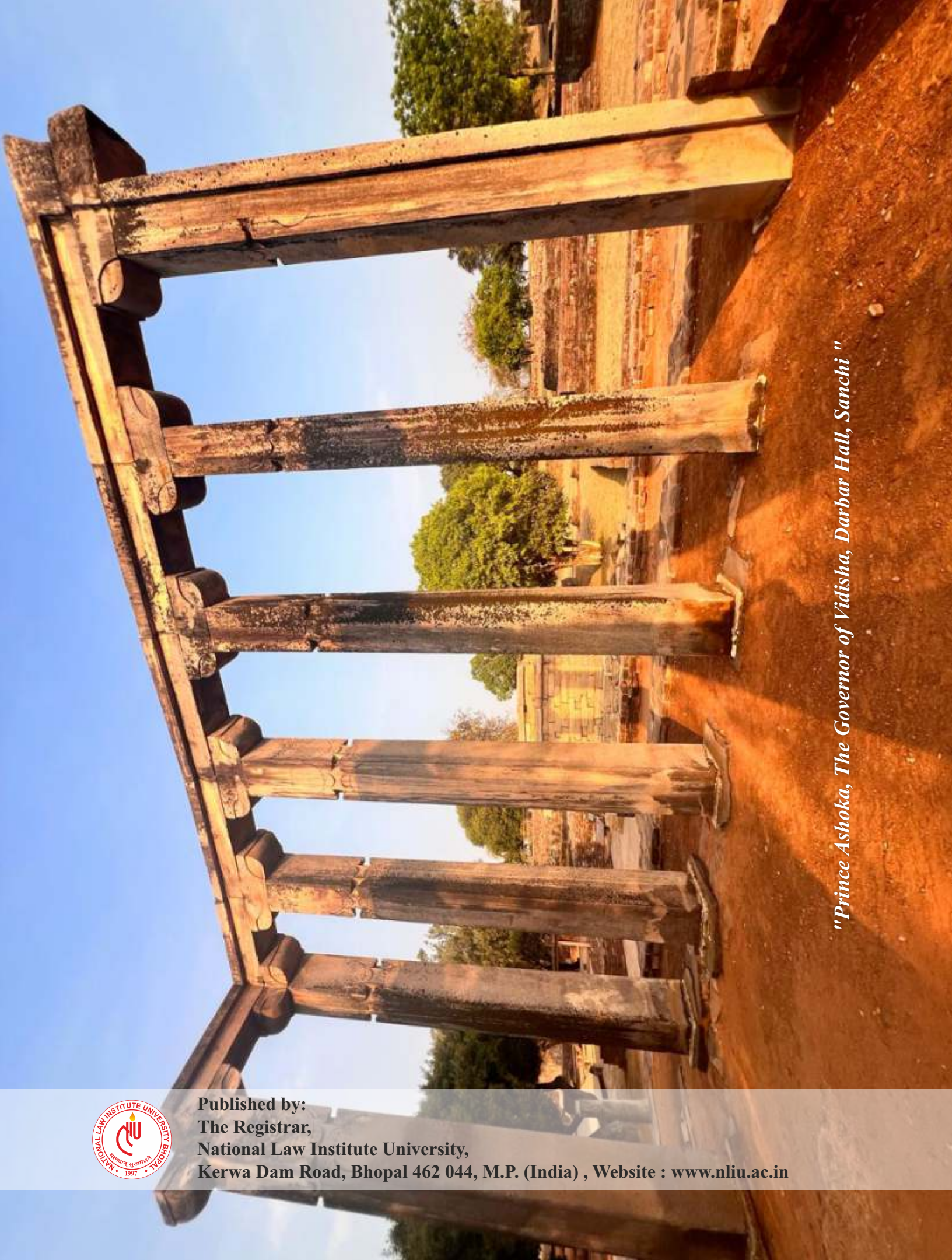
The distance from Bhopal to Sanchi is approximately 46 kilometers, making it a short and scenic drive of about 1.5 hours.
