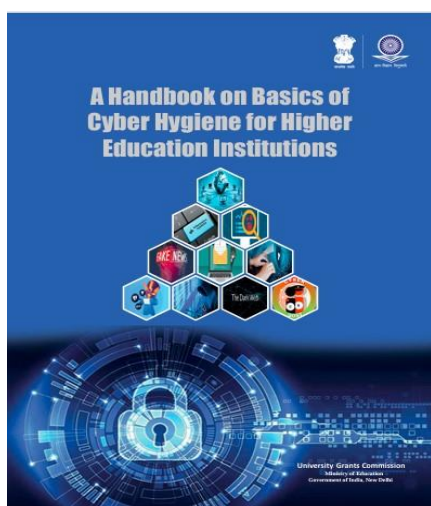
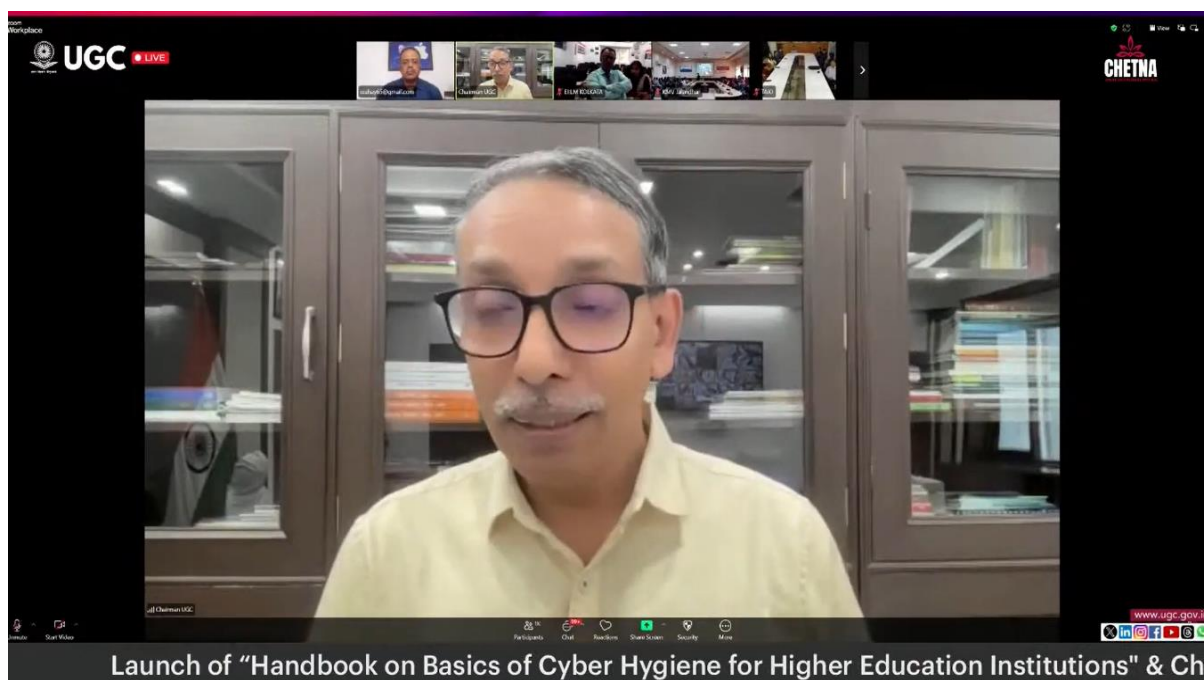


Drafting Handbook on Cyber Hygiene
