VISION AND OBJECTIVES OF THE UNIVERSITY

The National Law Institute University, Bhopal (NLIU), was established by the Rashtriya Vidhi Sansthan Vishwavidyalaya Adhiniyam, by an Act No. 41 of 1997 enacted by the Madhya Pradesh State Legislature. NLIU is recognized by the University Grants Commission and the Bar Council of India.

The vision of the National Law Institute University is to become one of the renowned centres of legal education, training and research in the world.

The objectives of the National Law Institute University are:

- ❖ To advance, disseminate and impart comprehensive legal education, learning and knowledge through distant and continuing legal education at all levels.
- ❖ To organize advanced studies and promote research in various branches of law.
- ❖ To disseminate legal knowledge and legal processes and their role in national development by organizing lectures, seminars, symposia, workshops and conferences.
- ❖ To promote cultural, legal and ethical values to promote and foster the rule of law and the objectives enshrined in the Constitution of India.
- ❖ To publish periodicals, treatises, study books, reports, journals and other literature on all subjects relating to law.
- ❖ To hold examinations and confer degrees, titles, diplomas or certificates and other academic distinctions.
- ❖ To promote legal awareness in the community for achieving social and economic justice.

2. FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR'S DESK



As per directions of Central Government, country wide lockdown was imposed from 23.03.2020 to 31.05.2020 and thus academic activities could not be held during this period. Further, in order to carry out the objective of the University, online classes of students of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) and MCLIS Course (2nd Year to 5th Year) commenced from 04.08.2020.

The Common Law Admission Test (CLAT-2020) was conducted on 28.09.2020 at four Centres in Bhopal, Two at Indore and One Centre each in Ujjain and Gwalior for admission to B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) and LL.M. Programs of the NLIU. The Result of CLAT 2020 was declared on 05.10.2020 and admission process commenced from 08.10.2020 to 09.10.2020 at the NLIU.

Later, the 3rd NLIU Link Legal National Client Counselling Competition was held online from 16.10.2020 to 18.10.2020 at the NLIU. The All India Written Test and Personal Interview of students for MCLIS Course for academic session 2020-21 was held from 22.10.2020 to 25.10.2020 and admission for this course was held on 28.10.2020.

Due to spread of Covid-19 Virus the Orientation Day and Commencement Day was held on 28.10.2020 and Prof. (Dr.) Ranbir Singh (Vice-Chancellor) being the Chief Guest blessed the newly admitted students of B.A.LL.B. and LL.M. Course by his word of wisdom on 28.10.2020.

Later, the 1st NLIU Khaitan International Negotiation Competition was held from 28.10.2020 to 01.11.2020 and the All India Written Test and Personal Interview for Ph.D. Course for academic session 2020-21 was held from 11.11.2020 to 12.11.2020 and admission for this course was held on 28.10.2020 and results were declared on 07.11.2020 and admission was held on 15.12.2020.

The online classes of students of MCLIS Course commenced from 02.11.2020 at the NLIU. The Webinar Series of ADRC Cell was held on 07.11.2020. Virtual Seminar on Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code 2016 on the topic “Regulator Road Ahead was held on 20.11.2020 and lectures by Dr. K.N. Chaturvedi (Former Legislative Secretary to Government of India) was held on 06.12.2020. The Open Defense Viva-Voce Exam of Ph.D. Students Mr. Sumit Bhattacharya and Mr. Abhinav Pradhan was held on 04.12.20 and 05.12.2020 respectively at the NLIU. One Day e-Conference of 20 years of Information Technology Act, 2000 was held on 19.12.2020 followed by Sixth International Conference on Law and Economics on 26.12.2020 at the NLIU.

Hon’ble Mr. Justice Mohd. Rafiq was sworn in as the 26th Chief Justice of High Court of Madhya Pradesh in a glittering ceremony held on 03.01.2021 at Raj Bhawan, Bhopal and the function was graced by many dignitaries. Hon’ble Mr. Justice Mohd. Rafiq is also the Chancellor of the NLIU in accordance with provision of Act No. 06 of 2018 of NLIU.

A Memorandum of Understanding was entered with the NLIU and Rajiv Gandhi Prodyogiki Vishwavidyalaya, Bhopal, regarding implementation of Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) and this software is meant for Examination, Finance, Administration related needs of the NLIU. A Credit Course on the topic “The Art of Purposeful Negotiation” was held on 14.01.2021 by Webinar on the topic “Litigation Prospectus in a Law Firm: Two Sides of the Same Coin was held on 19.01.2021”, and visit of Principals and Students of Colleges of Bhopal was made from 16.01.2021 to 21.01.2021 for choosing career in the field of Law.

Due to Covid-19, the 9th SBI Yono NLIU Corporate Law Moot Court Competition was held online from 22.01.2021 to 24.01.2021 with the participation of 24 teams of the Country. The Republic Day 2021 was held on 26.01.2021. The Webinar on the topic Privacy Laws in India and the Changing Nature of Gender Based Violence was held on 30.01.2021 and another webinars on the topics India's Approach to Domestic and International Climate Change Policy was held from 31.01.2021 to 01.02.2021 at the NLIU. Mrs. Shyamla S. Kundar (Member National Commission for Women, New Delhi) visited the NLIU on 09.02.2021 and held extensive discussion with presiding officers and members of Internal Complaint Committees of the NLIU, Jagran Lakecity University and Barkatullah University, Bhopal.

A Virtual Alumni Meet was held from 13.02.2021 to 14.02.2021 and Webinars on the topics Analysis of Medical Termination of Pregnancy (Amendment Act 2021) and Everything Every One Needs to Prevent Sextual Abuse was held on 14.02 2021 and 20.02.2021 at the NLIU. Tankha Memorial International Moot Court Competition was held online from 05.03.2021 to 07.03.2021 with the participation of 48 National Teams and 05 International Teams at the NLIU.

A Report was launched and a Webinar was held on the topic "Cast and Gender Violence" in collaboration with Campus Law Centre, University of Delhi, followed by Webinar on the topic "Basics of Bail" at the NLIU on 16.03.2021. The Virtual Classes was conducted by Pullar Volunteers for the children of local government schools at village Mendori, Bhopal, on regular basis. Further, a Donation Drive was initiated on 24.03.2021 to provide phones for the facilitation of local classes two people of Village Mendori, Bhopal.

LL.M.

NLIU introduced a two-year Master of Laws program in 2001. The program continued till 2012. However, in 2013, the University Grants Commission, following the recommendation of the National Knowledge Commission, made a transition from the two-year Masters program to a One-year Masters program. Therefore, in the academic session of 2013-14, NLIU aligned itself by introducing the One-year Master of Laws program with a specialization in the following areas: Constitutional and Administrative Law, Criminal

Law, Human Rights Law and Intellectual Property Rights and Business Law. The one-year LL.M. program is divided into three trimesters.

GIP

The National Law Institute University (NLIU) had submitted the Expression of Interest to the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India (IBBI) for the conduct of the Graduate Insolvency Program (GIP) on 15 January 2021. The IBBI has formally approved the National Law Institute University, Bhopal, vide letter dated 18 February 2021, for conducting the Graduate Insolvency Program (GIP) from the academic session 2021-2022. The intake for the two-year Graduate Insolvency Program will be 40 (forty). On receipt of the approval letter from IBBI, the NLIU had formerly communicated its acceptance to the IBBI. NLIU, Bhopal is the first University approved by the IBBI to offer the Graduate Insolvency Program.

The Graduate Insolvency Program is the first of its kind for those aspiring to take up the insolvency profession as a career in India and abroad and will benefit at entry-level and in career growth. This GIP would also provide opportunities to serve as in-house counsels or advisors to stakeholders in insolvency, liquidation, bankruptcy, or turnaround processes. GIP will be of great value to those who opt to become teachers or researchers or work in media houses. The Chairperson of IBBI, Dr. M. S. Sahoo, had observed that ‘the Graduate Insolvency Program is aimed at tapping the potential of young aspirants who have the dynamism and ability to excel in the field of insolvency resolution. A student who completes the GIP will be eligible for registration as an insolvency professional without having to wait to acquire the minimum 10 years’ experience as required by the Code at present’.

The Vice-Chancellor of NLIU, Bhopal, Prof. (Dr.) V. Vijayakumar, has constituted a Graduate Insolvency Programme Course Coordination Committee to oversee its effective implementation. Professor (Dr.) Ghayur Alam, Professor of Business Laws, is designated

as Course Director, Dr. Monica Raje as Deputy Course Director, Dr. Atul Kumar Pandey as member of this Committee, and Mr. Amit Pratap Singh as Course Coordinator. An Advisory Committee consisting of judges, representatives of industry, financial and credit institutions, practitioners, and academics is also being constituted exclusively for this purpose. For the effective and smooth running of GIP, an independent infrastructural facility within the NLIU campus is also being developed. This Graduate Insolvency Programme will commence from the next academic session 2021-22.

Ph.D.

The National Law Institute University started the Ph.D. program in 2001. During the initial years, the program was reserved only for faculty members. From 2010 onwards, the program was open for all.

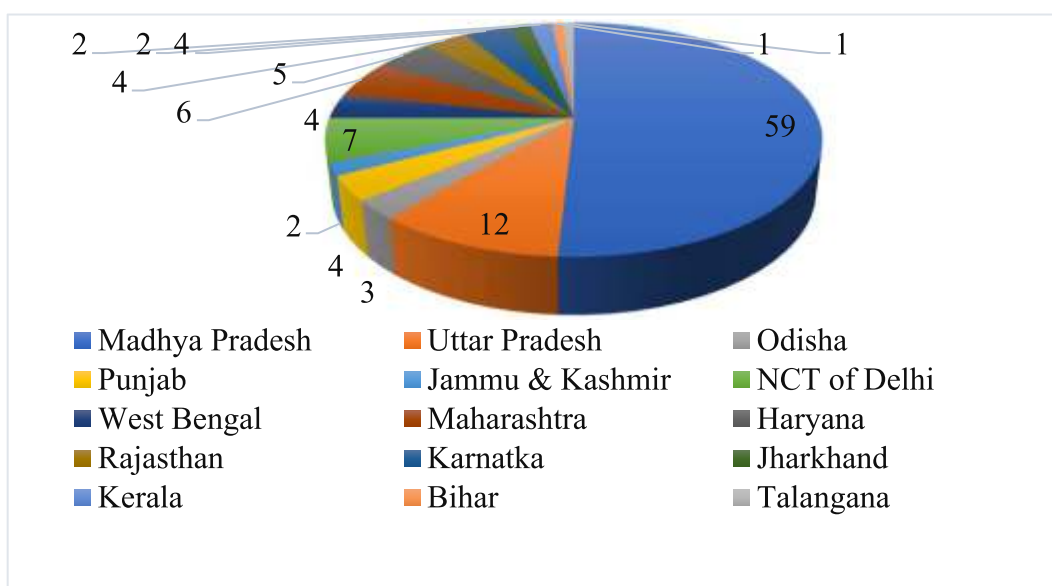

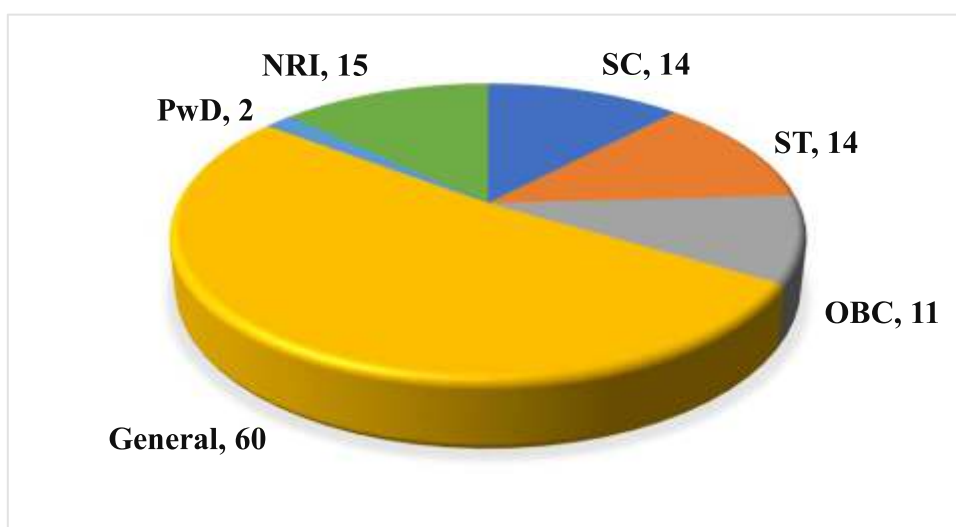

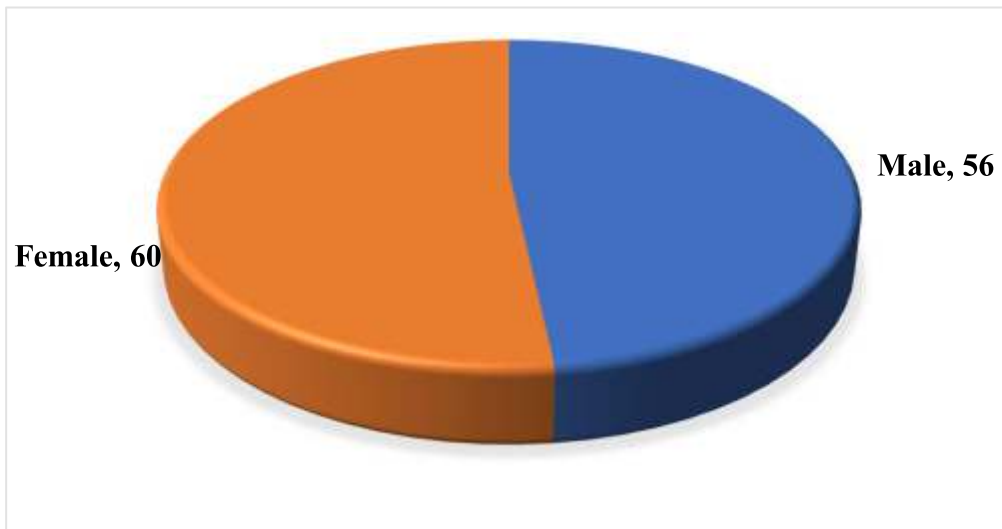
The state-wise distribution of the newly admitted students for 2020-21 is as follows:



The category-wise distribution of the newly admitted students for 2020-21 is as follows:

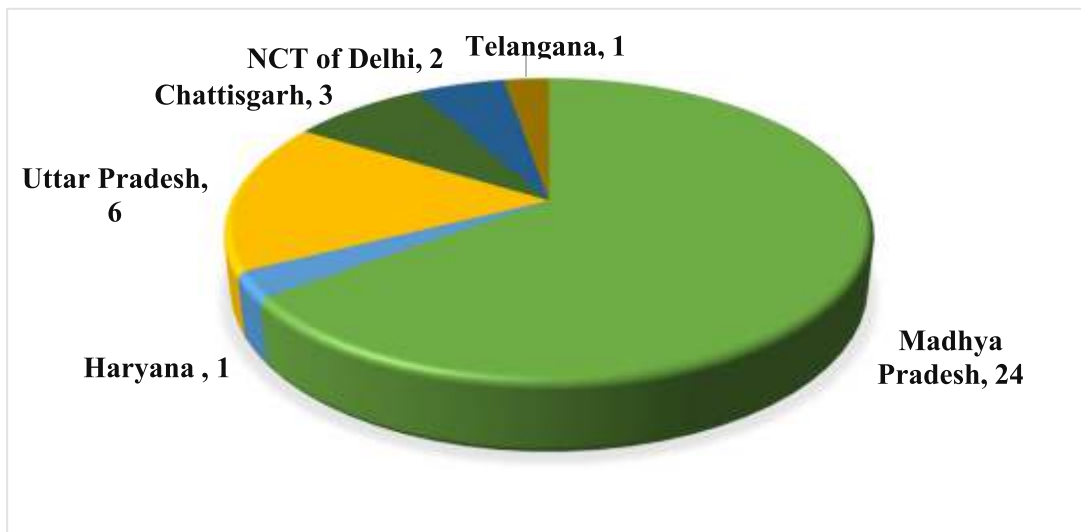

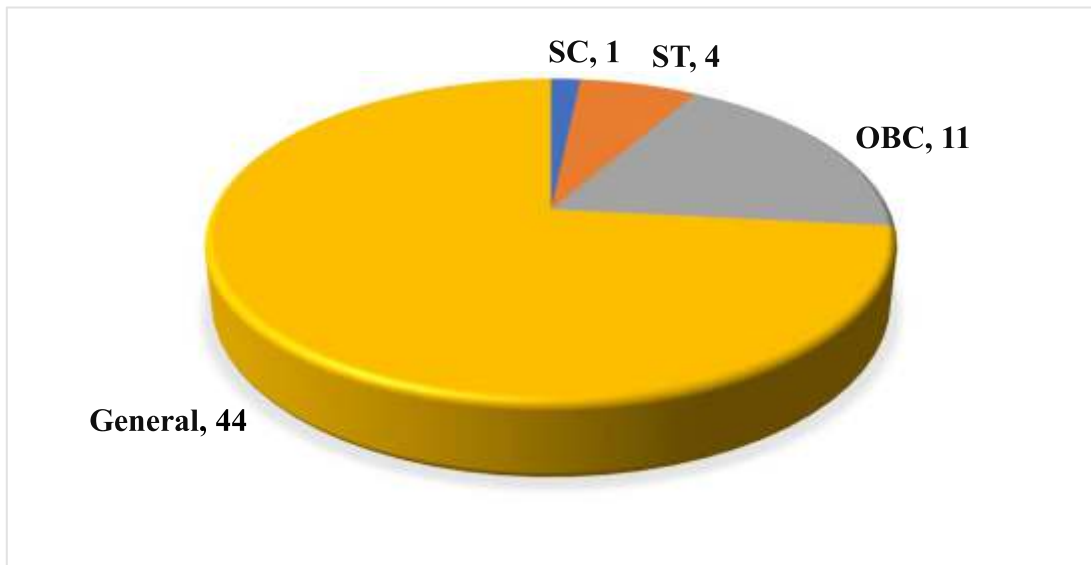

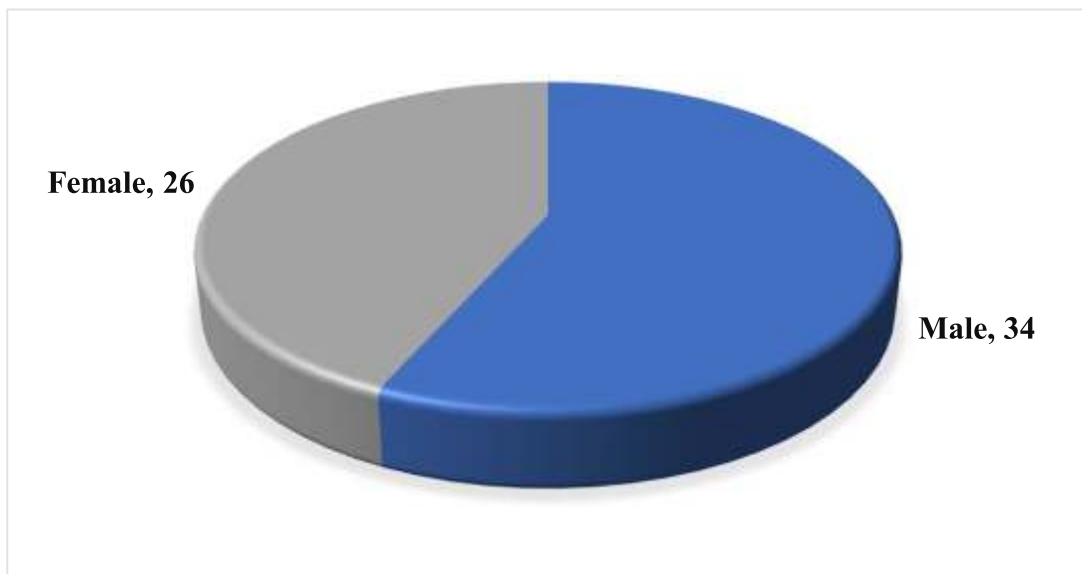

The category-wise distribution of the newly admitted students for 2020-21 is as follows:

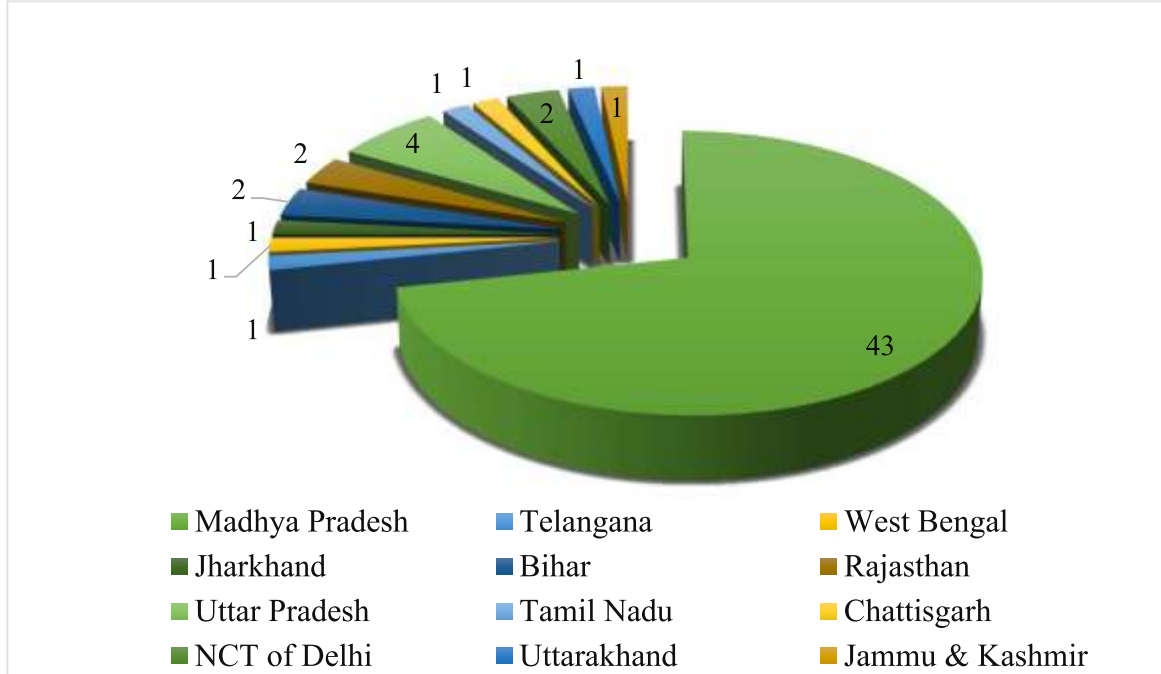

9. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The National Law Institute University, Bhopal, believes in encouraging students for their excellent academic performance. In furtherance of this, the University has instituted several medals for meritorious students in all the programs. The details of the medals are as follows:

I. JUSTICE J.S. VERMA MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Justice Jagdish Sharan Verma (18.01.1933 to 22.04.2013)

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Jagdish Sharan Verma, Former Chief Justice of India, is one of the most eminent justices of the country. He was born on January 18th 1933, in Satna, Madhya Pradesh. After receiving his early education at Satna and Lucknow, he obtained his B.Sc. and LL.B. degrees from the University of Allahabad. He enrolled as a pleader of the Judicial Commissioners' Court of erstwhile Vindhya Pradesh at Rewa in 1955 and as an advocate of the Madhya Pradesh High Court in 1959.

Justice Verma was appointed Judge of Madhya Pradesh High Court on September 12th 1972. He was the Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court and Rajasthan High Court from 1985 to 1989. He was assigned onerous duties to act as the Governor of Rajasthan not once but twice; in 1987 and 1989. His Lordship was elevated to the Supreme Court of India on June 3rd 1989, and occupied the highest position as the 27th Chief Justice of India on March 25th 1997.

Justice J.S.Verma was appointed Chairperson, National Human Rights Commission, on November 4th 1999. As the Chairperson of NHRC, he made a mark in upholding the human rights of the deprived, depressed and downtrodden members of the society. In addition, he headed several Commissions with distinction at the national level.

Justice Verma possessed several remarkable personality traits such as character and creativity, capability and confidence, commitment and craftsmanship, fairness, fearlessness, humility and honesty, impartiality and independence, to name a few. His clarity of thought and interpretative skills are reflected clearly in his judgments. Many judgments of Justice Verma are landmarks having contributed to humanizing the Indian legal system particularly, the criminal justice administration, constitutional jurisprudence and public law concepts. Justice Verma is known for his firm conviction that a 'judge must judge himself' to the values of the rule of law, judicial accountability and high standards in public life.

A collection of his famous speeches is published as a book titled 'New Dimensions of Justice'. His book titled 'New Universe of Human Rights' is evidence of his long-lasting contributions to the discipline of law and legal jurisprudence. His Lordship was conferred with '*Honoris Causa*' during the Fourth Convocation of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal, held on November 9th 2011.

His Lordship laid the foundation stone of The National Law Institute University, Bhopal, on May 12th 1997, in the august presence of Hon'ble Mr. Justice A.K.Mathur, the then Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh High Court, Shri Digvijay Singh, the then Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, Shri Rajendra Prasad Shukla, the then Minister of Higher Education, Govt. of Madhya Pradesh amongst other dignitaries.

The NLIU honouring his services to the legal profession in general and NLIU, in particular, has instituted the **University Gold Medal** in fond memory of His Lordship. This medal is awarded to the most meritorious student of the five-year integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) course of NLIU.

II. JUSTICE G.P. SINGH MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Hon'ble Mr. Justice Guru Prasanna Singh (03.01.1922 – 05.10.2013)

An embodiment of supreme qualities, Justice Guru Prasanna Singh was born on January 3rd 1922, in a small village of Raipur Karchulian in Rewa District of Madhya Pradesh. After completing his school education at Central Hindu School, Kashi (Banaras), Justice Singh had his college education at Banaras Hindu University. He completed his Masters of Science in 1941 by securing a top position in merit. After that, Justice Singh earned his law degree from Banaras Hindu University in 1944.

Hon'ble Justice G.P.Singh started his career in law in 1945 as a pleader of the court of erstwhile Rewa state and thereafter, in 1954, enrolled as an advocate in Rewa. After the reorganization of the States and the creation of Madhya Pradesh with the principal seat of the High Court at Jabalpur, Justice G.P.Singh shifted to Jabalpur and joined the High Court Bar in 1957.

Hon'ble Justice G.P. Singh was always an ideal and a source of inspiration to his fellow lawyers. He had throughout helped his junior lawyers in inculcating the highest values of professional conduct, including honesty, hard work and commitment to the cause of justice. He was throughout acclaimed for his impeccable integrity, forthright conduct and dedication towards his duties. Justice G.P. Singh was elevated to the Bench on November

7th 1967, as Additional Judge of the High Court of Madhya Pradesh and later appointed as permanent Judge on July 29th 1968. Considering his deep understanding of the judicial system and administrative capabilities, he was appointed as Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh High Court on July 27th 1978, which he held till January 1984. He had delivered several landmark judgments which adorn the law journals. Indeed, his judgments are testimony of his academic excellence and deep understanding of the law.

Hon'ble Justice G.P. Singh immensely contributed to the legal system. After demitting the office of the Chief Justice, he had rendered his valuable services in the capacity of Chairman, Madhya Pradesh Law Commission, from 1990 to 1992. He was appointed as Lokayukta of Madhya Pradesh on March 30th 1992, which he held office till March 29th 1997. During his tenure as Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh High Court, Justice Singh twice functioned as Acting Governor of Madhya Pradesh first- from May 26th 1981 to July 9th 1981 and after that from 21st September 1983 to 7th October 1983.

Justice G.P. Singh was a great scholar of law. During the initial days of his career, he was visiting faculty of law of T.R.S for about ten years. College, Rewa. Justice G.P. Singh has a flair for legal writing. His book, 'Principles of Statutory Interpretation', is internationally acclaimed as a masterpiece on statutory interpretation. The first edition of this famous book was published in 1966. Butterworths, Wadhwa, Nagpur, have also published a book, a collection of selected 49 judgments rendered by Justice G.P.Singh covering multiple aspects of law- civil, constitutional, criminal, and taxation. Gifted with the rare quality of research and legal analysis, Justice G.P. Singh had the occasion to revise the 24th edition of the famous treatise on Law of Torts. In recognition of the tremendous contribution made by Justice G.P. Singh to the judicial system, on January 7th 1984, he was awarded the Honorary Degree of Doctor of Law (LL.D) by Rani Durgavati University Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. In 2007, he was awarded the Degree of LL.D (*Honoris Causa*) by the National Law Institute University, Bhopal, in its First Convocation held on December 16th 2007.

III. JUSTICE SHACHEENDRA DWIVEDI MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi (25.01.1937 to 23.10.2006)

Justice Shri Shacheendra Dwivedi was born on January 25th 1937, at Isagarh, Guna. After having had his early education in D.A.V. School, Guna graduated in 1957 from Victoria

College, Gwalior. He took his law degree in 1959 from Delhi University and became a member of the Senate Law Faculty, Delhi University. He was also a member of Jiwaji University, Gwalior, and a part-time lecturer at MLB Government College, Gwalior.

Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi joined the Bar in 1960. As an advocate, he was elected as Secretary, President and Vice President of the High Court Bar Association. He was the Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee of the Bar Council at Gwalior and was an active member of the Rotary Club. He was appointed as Judge of the High Court in Madhya Pradesh in 1990. His tenure as a Judge of M.P. High Court was from July 28th 1990, to January 25th 1999. After superannuation, he was appointed Chairman of M.P. Electricity Regulatory Authority, Bhopal. In 2006 Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi headed the Committee appointed to investigate the gross misuse of administrative powers of the Speaker in administrative appointments and the irregularities that strained the dignity of the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat. The recommendations prove to be very useful in administrative appointments. He has also headed the Committee for Fixation of Fees for professional institutions. Justice Dwivedi believed that professional education should be available to both the upper class and the people from the lower rungs of society.

Mr. Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi was an expert in Constitutional Law and Environmental Law. Justice Dwivedi left for his heavenly abode on October 23rd 2006, and will always be remembered by the people of Madhya Pradesh for his invaluable contributions to this state and its people. The family of Late Justice Shacheendra Dwivedi has instituted the Gold Medal. This medal is awarded to a bonafide topper student of the LL.M. course of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal.

IV. NANI A. PALKHIWALA MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Mr. Nani A. Palkiwala (16.01.1920 to 11.12.2002)

Nani A. Palkhiwala was born in 1920 in Bombay to blue-collar, middle-class Parsi parents. His family name derives from the profession of his forefathers (a common practice among Parsis), who had been manufacturers of palanquins ('palkhis'). He was educated in Masters Tutorial High School and later at St. Xavier's College, both in Bombay. He was a dedicated scholar and excelled even though hampered by a bad stammer. At college, he earned a Masters' degree in English literature and also overcame his speech impediment.

Upon graduating, Palkhiwala applied for a position as Lecturer at Bombay University but could not secure the post. Soon found himself trying to obtain admissions to institutions of higher learning to further his academic career. He enrolled at Government Law College, Bombay, where he discovered that he had a gift for unravelling the intricacies of jurisprudence. Mr. Nani Palkhiwala was called to the Bar in 1944 and served in the chambers of the legendary Sir Jamshedji Behramji Kanga in Bombay. He quickly gained a reputation as an eloquent and articulate Barrister. He was often the Center of attention in court, where students of law and younger members of the Bar Association would flock to watch him. His excellent court craftsmanship and an extraordinary ability to recall barely known facts rendered him an irresistible force. Mr. Nani Palkhiwala initial forte was commercial and tax law. Together with Jamshedji, he authored what was then and still is today an authoritative work: '**The Law and Practice of Income Tax.**' He was thirty years old at the time of first printing. Sir Jamshedji later admitted that the credit for this work belongs exclusively to Mr. Palkhiwala.

Mr. Palkhiwala's first participation in a case of constitutional significance occurred in 1951, where he served as junior counsel in the case *Nusserwanji Balsara v State of Bombay* [(1951) Bom. 210], assisting the esteemed Sir Noshirwan Engineer in challenging several provisions of the Bombay Prohibition Act. Before the year was out, Palkhiwala was arguing cases himself, but he lost his first case of constitutional importance (a challenge of the validity of Land Requisition Acts) before the Bombay High Court. By 1954, however, barely ten years after his admission to the Bar, Palkhiwala was arguing before the Supreme Court. It was during his first case before the apex court (concerning the interpretation of Article 29 (2) and Article 30 of the Indian Constitution, which regulates the rights of religious minorities) that he first articulated his (later) famous statements on the inviolate nature of the Constitution. As a result, Mr. Palkhiwala received a great deal of recognition from academics, academic institutions and the government.

In 1963, Palkhiwala was offered a seat in the Supreme Court but declined. In 1968, he was offered the position of Attorney-General by Shri Govind Menon, the then Law Minister in the Congress Government. Mr. Palkhiwala recounts in his book '*We the Nation*',

'After a great deal of hesitation, I agreed. When I was in Delhi, I conveyed my acceptance to him, and he told me that the announcement would be made the next day. I was happy that the agonising hours of indecision were over. Sound sleep is one of the blessings I have always enjoyed. That night, I went to bed and looked forward to my usual quota of deep slumber. But suddenly and inexplicably, I became wide awake at three o'clock in the morning with the clear conviction, floating like a hook through my consciousness that my

decision was erroneous and that I should reverse it before it was too late. Early in the morning, I profusely apologized to the law minister for changing my mind. In the years immediately following, it was my privilege to argue on behalf of citizens, under the same Congress Government and against the government, the major cases which have shaped and moulded [...] constitutional law [...].'

Mr. Nani Palkhiwala was appointed Indian Ambassador to the United States in 1977 by the Janta Government (the first non- Congress Government in India) headed by Late Shri Morarji Desai and served in the capacity till 1979. He received Honorary Doctorates from Princeton University, Rutgers University, Lawrence University, University of Wisconsin-Madison, Annamalai University, Ambedkar Law University, and Mumbai. The laudation from Princeton called him '...Defender of constitutional liberties, champion of human rights...' and stated, 'he has courageously advanced him the conviction that expediency in progress, at the cost of freedom, is no progress at all, but retrogression. Lawyer, teacher, author, and economic developers, he brings to us as Ambassador of India intelligence, good humour, experience, and vision for international understanding...'.'

In the last year of his life, Mr. Nani Palkhiwala was severely affected by what may have been Alzheimer's disease. According to Attorney General Soli J. Sorabjee, who had known him for many years, 'it was painful to see that a person so eloquent and articulate unable to speak or recognize persons except occasionally in a momentary flash.' Mr. Nani Palkhiwala was taken critically ill on December 7th, 2002. He died on Wednesday, December 11th, 2002. He was 82 years of age.

The Nani A. Palkhiwala Memorial Trust, Mumbai, instituted the Nani A. Palkhiwala Gold Medal in 2006. This medal is awarded every year to the bonafide topper of the LL.M. Program of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal.

V. PROFESSOR V.S. REKHI GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Professor (Dr.) V.S. Rekhi, (01.08.1937 to 04.02.2008)

Professor (Dr.) Virendra Singh Rekhi was born in Bijawar (District Chatarpur) and later shifted to District Datia of Madhya Pradesh. He obtained the Degree of LL.B. from Agra University and LL.M. from the University of Lucknow. He obtained the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy from the Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh (AMU). He served Lucknow University as a Lecturer from 1959 to 1966. After that, he joined AMU as a faculty and became a Reader and Professor of Constitutional Law. He served as the Dean, Faculty of Law, AMU and Head of the Law Department, AMU not once, twice, but thrice. This itself is a testimony to his administrative capabilities in addition to his academic excellence. His

acceptability in the teaching community of AMU can be gauged from the fact that he was unanimously elected as the President, Staff Association, AMU at a very crucial historical moment of AMU. It was the moment after *Aziz Basha*, the minority character of AMU, was debated in the Parliament of India. The way Professor Rekhi pleaded the cause made him become the blue-eyed boy of AMU. It spoke volumes about the non-negotiable faith of Professor Rekhi in the constitutional ideal of secularism. He served on different committees of various universities and governments. He superannuated from the AMU in 1997.

After superannuating from AMU, he was appointed as the **Founder Director of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal**. He served NLIU from 06-05-1998 to 04-06-2003. He laid the academic foundation of NLIU and developed the curriculum of B.A.LL.B (Hons.). He made tireless efforts in establishing NLIU as the prime centre of legal education and research. Reading Materials distributed to students were prepared under his exclusive supervision.

Professor Rekhi was awarded the prestigious Fulbright Fellowship and the Fellowship of the American Council of Learned Society. A law teacher widely acclaimed by students and the academic community both in India and abroad. Professor Rekhi has left a legacy of legal learning. Besides being an effective law teacher, Professor Rekhi has a passion for reading literature, sociology, history, economics, political science, medicine and technology. The knowledge informed his approach to the teaching of other disciplines, which he brought to bear on legal discourse. He visited and lectured at various International Universities of the world, such as Harvard and Wisconsin.

In recognition of his services rendered to legal education and research, NLIU has instituted University Gold Medal in his fond memory. This medal is awarded to the meritorious student in the final year of the Five-year integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) program of NLIU.

VI. PANDIT RAMLALJI SHARMA MEMORIAL AWARD

Pt. Ramlalji Sharma, lovingly called Kakkaji, was a man of principles and the epitome of selflessness and sacrifice. He was born on 17th June 1910 in Dolaria near Hoshangabad. He did his Masters in Economics from Morris College, Nagpur and was a gold medalist. He also graduated in Law and started practice in 1933. He was a man of great accomplishment. His persona was an effortless blend of educational, religious, spiritual, social, cultural, economic and agricultural interests. He was not only an educationist and an eminent lawyer but a social worker too, a combination to be rarely found in a man.

His dedication to the field of education was exemplary. Moreover, he was a man of vision. His idea was to build a college where academics are of unmatched standards, the staff is highly qualified, and students who channel their energies towards education and make efforts on being men of character. The Narmada Mahavidyalaya or NMV hence is renowned for discipline. The ascent of college from its humble state with limited classrooms and an ever-growing number of students to the present state is still remembered by people who have had the privilege to be a part of such an educational system.

He was an eminent lawyer. His powerful oration and incredible intelligence gave him immense fame and credibility. He practised law and appeared before the courts of Hoshangabad and Bhopal. Additionally, he appeared before the High-Courts of Gwalior, Jabalpur and Allahabad and the Supreme Court. He established one of the largest libraries in the area, which included All-India Reporters and other journals. He was the jewel of the Hoshangabad Bar Association. Due to his intellect and incredible knowledge of the subject, he earned a name for himself from district Courts to High Court and the Supreme Court.

Pt. Ramlalji Sharma never sought donations as the idea of begging was repugnant to him. He had a constructive mindset and epitomized an ever-active life. Being an eminent lawyer and educationist, he taught in Narmada Mahavidyalaya as early as the 1950s. He also established around 15 educational institutions throughout the district of Hoshangabad, with the sole motive of imparting education to the unreached.

He introduced the discipline of Arts in 1954, Commerce and Science in 1958 on the graduation level in the Narmada Mahavidyalaya. He taught English Literature and Economics classes in 1963, Hindi Literature and Commerce in 1964, Mathematics and Botany in 1969 and 1970 in Economics and Zoology on the Post-graduation level.

He was a progressive agriculturalist and a profoundly religious man. An insight into his pursuit of religion stands in the form of Satsang Bhawan on the bank on River Narmada, a place where holy men would stay, and devout persons would assemble to listen to religious

discourses. In addition, he had immense faith in Ramayana. Every year when the courts would be off in the summers, he went on a pilgrimage to Badrinath and Kedarnath and spent at least a month in Haridwar.

He was an institution in himself. His life devoted to education and social work remains embedded in the minds of the people who had the honour to be associated with him. He had so much to offer to all of them, and they had so much to learn from him. He was a legend and shall remain so for centuries to come.

VII. MRS. PRATIBHA DUBEY MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Late Mrs. Pratibha Dubey was the wife of eminent Dr. Ajay Prakash Dubey of Bhopal. She obtained her M.A. in Economics from Bhopal. Mrs. Dubey wrote short stories, poetry and also authored books. Her articles were published in Newspapers. She also sang devotional songs (Bhajans). She narrated the Dohas written by Shri A.K. Payasi, Former Principal Secretary of Vidhan Sabha. She left behind two daughters, Ms. Pallavi, Ms. Dipika and a son Mr. Animesh Dubey. Her daughter Ms. Dipika Dubey was the bonafide student of five years integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) program of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal, from 1999-2004.

Dr. Ajay Prakash Dubey and Mr. Animesh Dubey has instituted the Gold Medal and Scholarship in fond memory of Late Mrs. Pratibha Dubey. This medal is awarded to meritorious final year student of the five-year integrated B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) program of the NLIU.

VIII. MR. RIZWAN SHAAD MEMORIAL GOLD MEDAL AWARD

Mr. Rizwaan Shaad (23.03.1990 to 19.09.2013)

Mr. Rizwaan Shaad hailed from the Bohra Muslim Community of Gujarat. His father Dr. Anwar Shaad, lives in Ujjain. He was the bonafide student of two-year Master of Science in Cyber Law & Information Security (MS-CLIS) Course of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal. He obtained his B.E. Degree in the area of Information Technology from Rajiv Gandhi Proudogiki Vishwavidyalaya. He was the first student of the Bohra community to be enrolled for the prestigious MS-CLIS Course of the National Law Institute University, Bhopal, in the academic session 2012-13.

Mr. Shaad met his untimely death in a tragic car accident on September 19 2013. A gold medal was instituted in his fond memory by his father. This medal is awarded to meritorious Final year student of Two-year MS-CLIS Course of the NLIU.

15. LIBRARY

The National Law Institute University's library is situated at the heart of campus in Gyan Mandir, an essential element in furthering academic and research excellence. Over the past couple of years, it has continued to develop collections in emerging academic areas, providing access to authoritative electronic resources vital for scholarship and research. Library uses state-of-the-art technology to capture treasures from its collections and showcase them to the academic community. The library has an Advisory Committee comprises of Faculty Members and the Deputy Librarian. Prof. (Dr.) Ghayur Alam is the Chairman of the Library Committee, and Dr. S.S. Khushwah, Deputy librarian, acts as the member convenor for the committee. The Committee meets regularly to discuss various library-related issues. The purpose of the Committee is to recommend measures to make the library user-friendly and advise on library policies, reviews users' feedback, and recommend action on issues related to infrastructure, collections, and services. The library is also accessible to differently-abled people.

15.1 Library Facilities

The library acquires materials that meet the current and foreseeable future needs for teaching and research at the University. The selection of sources is made to ensure a balanced collection between types of material, jurisdictions and courses offered each year within the existing budgetary constraints. The collection development policy strives to support a high level of achievement in teaching and research. The library subscribes to international and national journals. Apart from the subscription to the journals and law reviews, the university library also receives significant foreign periodicals and law reviews on Gratis and Exchange bases.

Some of the facilities provided in the library are RFID (Radio Frequency Identification System) based security system, Circulation Services, Orientation and Training Access to Legal Information, OPAC. Furthermore, there are six Network Terminals available in the library to facilitate browsing of the online catalogue, electronic databases, CD-ROM databases, and Similarity Check through the Urkund Software. In addition, the library has

software and hardware like JAWS (Job Access with Speech), Kurzweil 1000 and Index Braille.

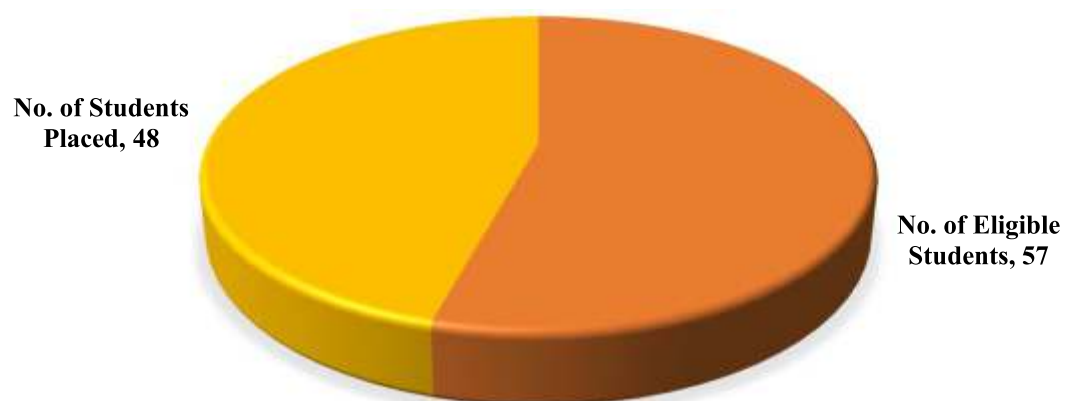

19. INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

19.1 Campus and Infrastructure

The University's sprawling 50-acre (approx) campus is set amidst lush greenery and is situated on a hillock with state-of-the-art infrastructure and excellent facilities.

➤ **Academic Block I (AB-I) and Academic Block II (AB-II)**

The aesthetically designed buildings have spacious, air-conditioned classrooms. All the classrooms are smart classrooms with ICT facilities, including Smart Boards, Audio Visual Facility, and LCD projectors. AB-I and AB-II are accessible to specially-abled students through the ramp and lift, respectively. They also have a foyer area for the easy movement of the students.

➤ **Gyan Mandir**

The aptly titled resource center located at the heart of the campus houses the university library. With more than 15000 books in print form, spread on three floors and other E-Learning resources/databases, the library is accessible to all the students on and outside the campus. The building is disabled friendly. Apart from the library, 'Gyan Mandir' also has faculty chambers, classrooms for postgraduate students, a moot courtroom and a video conference room. The IT Section and Computer Lab are established on the ground floor of the 'Gyan Mandir'.

➤ **Rajiv Gandhi National Cyber Law Centre**

The complex also boasts of an ultra-modern gymnasium which consists of the latest equipment for maintaining the physical fitness and health of the students.

The building provides basic medical facilities for students and staff members. Both male and female doctors, duly qualified staff and proper stock of medicines have been ensured by the University for the wellbeing of the students. Apart from this, the building also has a provisional general store, keeping a variety of merchandise needed for regular use by the students and staff members.

➤ **Residential facilities**

Hostel facilities are provided separately for boys and girls with single/double occupancy rooms, common recreational rooms, a small gymnasium and high-speed wireless internet connectivity, creating a conducive environment for research and academic growth of students. The University also has a campus residential facility for the faculty and administrative staff.

➤ **Guest House**



4. BASIS FOR QUALIFIED OPINION

OBSERVATIONS REGARDING ACCOUNTING SYSTEM ADOPTED BY BOARD:

i) NON-RECONCILIATION OF BANK ACCOUNTS

Bank balances have not been properly reconciled, which are in detail on subsequent pages of this report. The accounts are subject to effect due to these unreconciled items.

ii) NON ADHERANCE TO ACCOUNTING STANDARDS

Following Accounting Standards (AS) issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India has not been completely complied with:-

- AS 5: Net Profit/Loss for the Period, Prior Period items & changes in accounting policies
- AS 9: Revenue Recognition
- AS 15: Employee Benefits
- AS 22: Accounting For Taxes on Income
- AS 28: Impairment of Assets.

Detailed reasons and observation in this regard have been separately reported. Further, on account of incomplete information with regard to various Discrepancies, their financial impact on accounts cannot be quantified.

1. Capital Reserve Grant

As per explanation provided by accounts department followings are the expenditures incurred by the University out of the own funds, for which the grant is still receivable:

2. Unidentified Fee

Unidentified Fee A/c Rs. 50695/- of F.Y.2018-19 is not reconciled. This is not rectified till the end of FY 2020-21 by the Management.

3. Current Liabilities and Provisions

It is explained by accounts department that amount received for remit of scholarship to eligible student still unutilized and the balance is carried forward in books of accounts of Rs.31,34,678/- since 2013. This amount is shown in "Other Liabilities Schedule – 9".

4. Caution Money

There is no student-wise detail list available in case of Caution Money amounting to Rs. 68,32,572 Since long. This amount is shown in "Schedule - 09 Other Liabilities". Hence, the same have to be refund back to the students at the time of Completion of Course.



5. Project Liabilities

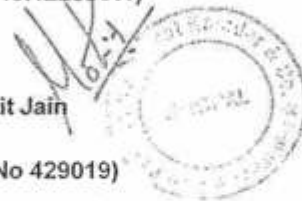

Earmarked and Endowment fund Created from Earmarked in the nature of capital from M.P. Government and UGC is accounted in accordance with AS-12.

5. Fixed Assets:

Fixed Assets are Stated at Cost less Accumulated Depreciation. The Cost of an asset comprises its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to working conditions for its intended use. Expenditure for addition's, Improvement and renewals are capitalised and expenditure for maintenance and repairs are Charged to Income and Expenditure Account. Fixed assets acquired out of Capital funds are Stated at cost and corresponding grant Shown as Capital Funds under liabilities.

6. Depreciation

Depreciation is Charged as per Income Tax Act 1961.

7. Investments:

All Investments are stated at cost.


8. Income Tax:


The Income of the institution is exempt from Income Tax under section 10(23) (c) of the Income Tax Act. No provision for tax is therefore made in the accounts.






