## ATTENDANCE RULES

Attendance rules as prescribed by clause 12 of the Legal Education, 2008 reads as under:

No student of any of the degree program shall be allowed to take end semester test in a subject if the student concerned has not attended minimum of 70% of the classes held in the subject concerned as also the moot court exercises, tutorials and practical training conducted in the subject taken together.

Provided that if a student for any exceptional reasons fail to attend 70% of the classes held in any subject, the Dean of the University or the Principal of the Centre of Legal Education, as the case may be, may allow the student to take the test if the student concerned attended at least 65% of the classes held in the subject concerned and attended 70% of the classes in all the subjects taken together. The similar power shall rest with the Vice-Chancellor or Director of a National Law University, or his authorized representative in the absence of the Dean of Law.

Provided further that a list of such students allowed to take the test with reasons recorded be forwarded to the Bar Council of India.

In accordance with the aforesaid Regulations, relaxation in attendance may be granted, for any exceptional reasons, only if: (i) a student has attended 70% of the classes in all the subjects taken together and, (ii) has also attended at least 65% of the classes held in the subject concerned. A student who does not fulfil the conditions prescribed in either (i) or (ii), her/his application for relaxation in attendance shall not be entertained.
