- (ii) **P2-** Size of the Bench (Single, Division, Full or Constitutional) –Names of judges or members as the case may be– Name of the judge or member who delivered the opinion, Names of advocates appearing on behalf of both parties/all parties; Interveners if any; Amicus if any - **02 Marks**
- (iii) **P3-**Material Facts of the case. – **03 Marks**
- (iv) **P4-** Issues/questions raised before the Court/Tribunal. Whether pure question of fact, or pure question of law, or mixed question of law and fact. - **02 Marks**


